Off-Season News

Mick Gargan To Coach Western Park – *From the Gazette:* “Nilma Darnum premiership captain Mick Gargan will coach Western Park in the WDCA this season. And Country Week batsman Keith Alger is seeking a clearance from Drouin to Western Park. Known as ‘the club with the turf wicket’, Western Park is set for a great 1982-83 season. However, the annual general meeting – attended by 20 enthusiasts – was told there are a few problems with turf wicket maintenance. Conservative estimate of cost per season to maintain the project is \$1500 and this is a bit beyond the fundraising capabilities of a cricket club. On the basis that a turf wicket benefits local cricket generally and not just the resident club, Western Park is seeking financial assistance from the Warragul Shire, Gippsland Cricket League, and Warragul and District Cricket Association. Mr. Graeme Hogan, re-elected for his third term as President, informed the annual meeting that a three phase one tonne electric roller has been purchased. A set of covers – 25m x 80m – will be purchased over the next few weeks so the club is doing plenty itself to boost the turf. Other leading executive officers are Messrs John Kane (Vice-President), Alan Ross (Treasurer), and Gary Knight (Secretary).

Record 51 Teams Enter Cricket – “Warragul and District cricket opens on Saturday October 2 with a record of 38 senior and 13 junior teams. Warragul API and Warragul Tech Staff are new teams in D-Grade and the previously combined Buln-Buln-Jindivick are now separate junior teams. All other senior teams are back again for what promises to be another exciting battle for top honours in all grades. Opening rounds will be two-day matches with a couple of one-day matches in January during the Christmas holidays.”

WDCA Draw Irks Trafalgar – “Trafalgar is incensed with a WDCA executive decision to demote its minor teams down a grade. Trafalgar wanted to play in B and C-Grade but has been dropped to C and D-Grade to obviate a bye caused by the admission of Neerim District to B-Grade. Mr. Ray Burgess – a committee man at Trafalgar – said last night his club is most unhappy about the decision and would make another attempt even at this late hour to be reinstated in the grades it had applied for. Many worry at Trafalgar that a player dropped from the A-Grade team has to go down two grades to C-Grade rather than the stronger B-Grade. It must be pointed out that the executive had 40 teams to place in four grades. While certainly unlucky for Trafalgar, the four grades have been finalised with an ideal 10 teams in each one.”

But Ellinbank lost top-class young batsman Glen Atherton and Cutler for only seven off 4.2 overs before stumps to give Western Park some hope of getting back into the game – much to the delight of Yarragon.”

WDCA Lethargy Is Not Cricket! – *From the Trader (by Clem Pitt, February 24th):* “Several aspects of Warragul and District cricket need a shake-up if the 53-team Association is to survive as a major force. An instance is the penalties inflicted on several clubs for infringing a rule relevant to registration of players no doubt justified under the rules – but why did it take nearly three months to impose them? Surely these matters could have been discovered and dealt with early in December – not late in February – when teams battling to be in the finals suddenly found themselves on the penalty list. Whatever the reason, the executive must look at ways of making sure this delay does not happen again, if only to avoid ill feeling like that aroused at the moment.

And the media representative under pressure for several seasons trying to provide a comprehensive cover of local cricket has suffered the ultimate indignity – an incorrect article. This pertains to the Gazette last Tuesday when we wrote that Warragul had qualified for the GCL U-23 final next Sunday. In fact, Warragul were beaten and it’s their opponents Traralgon, who are Bairnsdale’s rival in the final. Our information in relation to the U-23 team came from a senior cricketer who was obviously wrong. This cricketer is not blamed for the error. Had someone from the U-23 team had the courtesy to drop in the match scores or scorebook, the error could not have occurred.... We made the error and must accept responsibility for it.

But the lethargy noted in some sections of the WDCA towards domestic affairs and the media is not good for cricket and is not going to be allowed to develop, while we have one breath left in demanding efficiency at all levels of what is a magnificent association of district cricket clubs.”

President's Report (by Graeme Hogan from Western Park CC Annual Report)

"Obviously the highlight of the year was the winning of the WDCA B-Grade Premiership by Western Park, which was the club's first senior premiership since changing its name from St. Andrews. 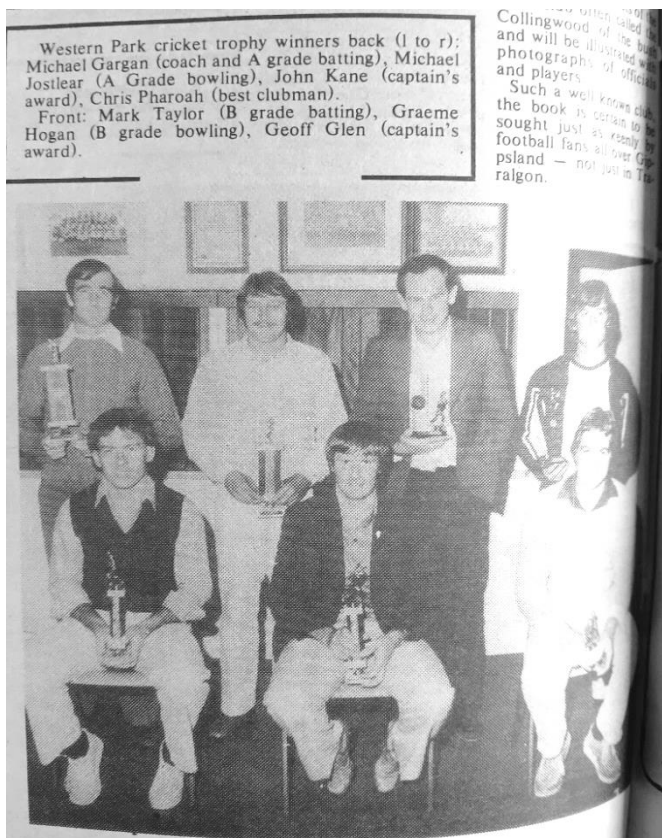

With this same dedication to succeed in A-Grade, Western Park will 'come of age'. With this in mind and the progress of the turf wicket, we are very hopeful for more success in the future."



Captain's Report (by Mick Gargan from Western Park CC Annual Report)

"The 1982/83 season proved to be a most disappointing one for A-Grade. After finishing in the prominent position just outside the four in '81/82, the team's performance actually fell below this level and never seriously challenged as a contender for the finals after losing the first game at Trafalgar in mediocre fashion. Throughout the season it was my policy to select the side on performances in A-Grade and below which often centred on replacement due to lack of performance in the higher grade rather than a particularly good one from the lower grades.

From the start of the season and in the lead-up to it, emphasis was placed on the batting as it was this area which during past season the team showed an inability to make consistently worthwhile scores and give the bowlers something to bowl at. Though an attempt was made to make the batsman aware of faults in technique by direction and batting exercises, the performances were generally poor due to a combination of pre-season apathy to attendance at training and later a cavalier approach to match batting, which indicated a certain lack of real commitment to the task, or a lack of pride in individual performances. As is evidenced from the competition score sheets, all sides at different stages were on the receiving end from batsmen. This happened on no more than three occasions against out bowling attack and in each case was compounded by poor fielding. Both front-line bowlers – John Kane and Mick Jostlear – were as effective as any other opposing duo and better than most. They were usually well supported – particularly as the season went on – by Alan Ross.

Paul Gavin deserves a special mention as I believe his wicket-keeping – while never completely fit – was of a standard which suggests with work, he will be a very good wicket-keeper indeed. Needs to say, what would the club do without John Kane, the Inter-League representative, curator, wicket-taker, administrator (ex-husband), etc.

Players with the natural ability of Howard Copley, Craig Humphrey, Peter & Alan Ross – just to name a few – offer the team real grounds for optimism, but there is grave danger that the same players will remain categorised as have most who have gone before them and will come after them: "He's got potential, but..." Teams such as Warragul and Nilma Dusties have proven that the loss of well-performed individuals has created better overall team efforts with more contributors and it is this fact that leads me to believe that Western Park can and will succeed in the 1983/84 season. Finally, though success was not forthcoming in the last season, I did gain considerable enjoyment out of playing with my new teammates and say without hesitation that if the club can maintain the addition of this type to its ranks, eventual success is assured."

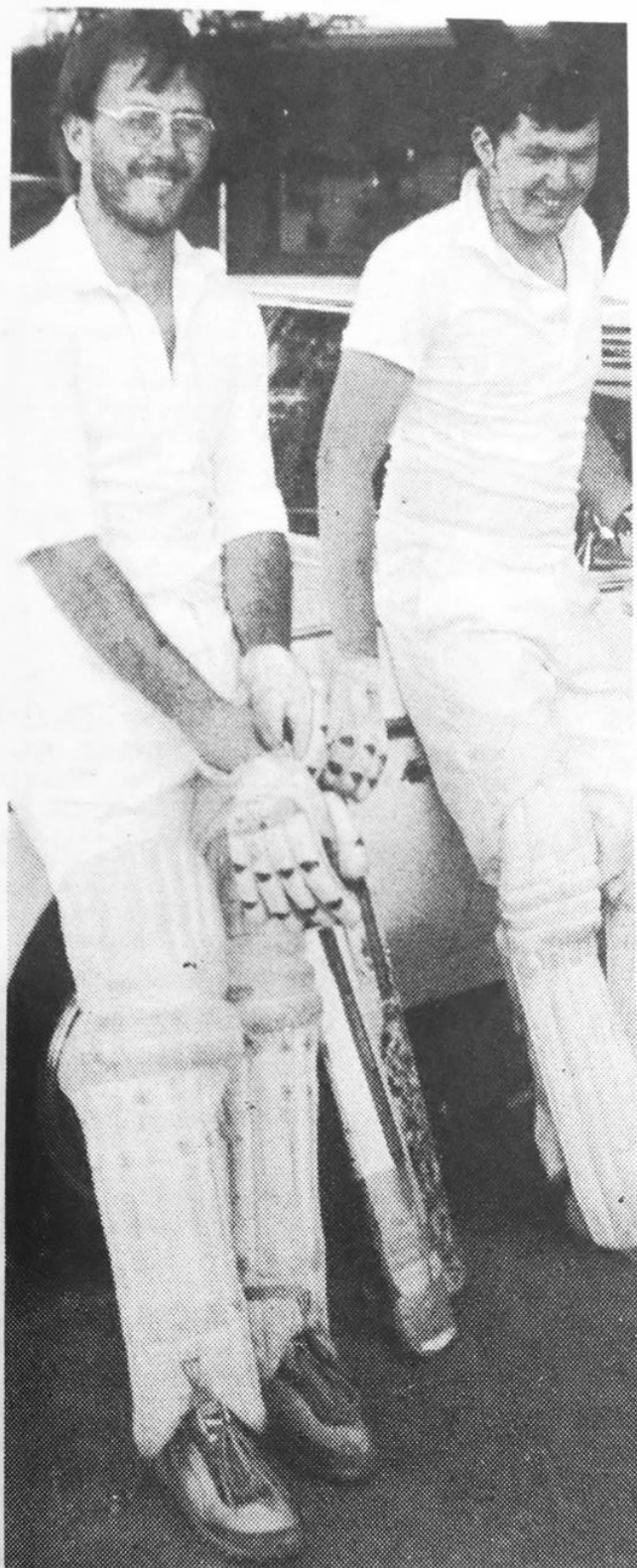

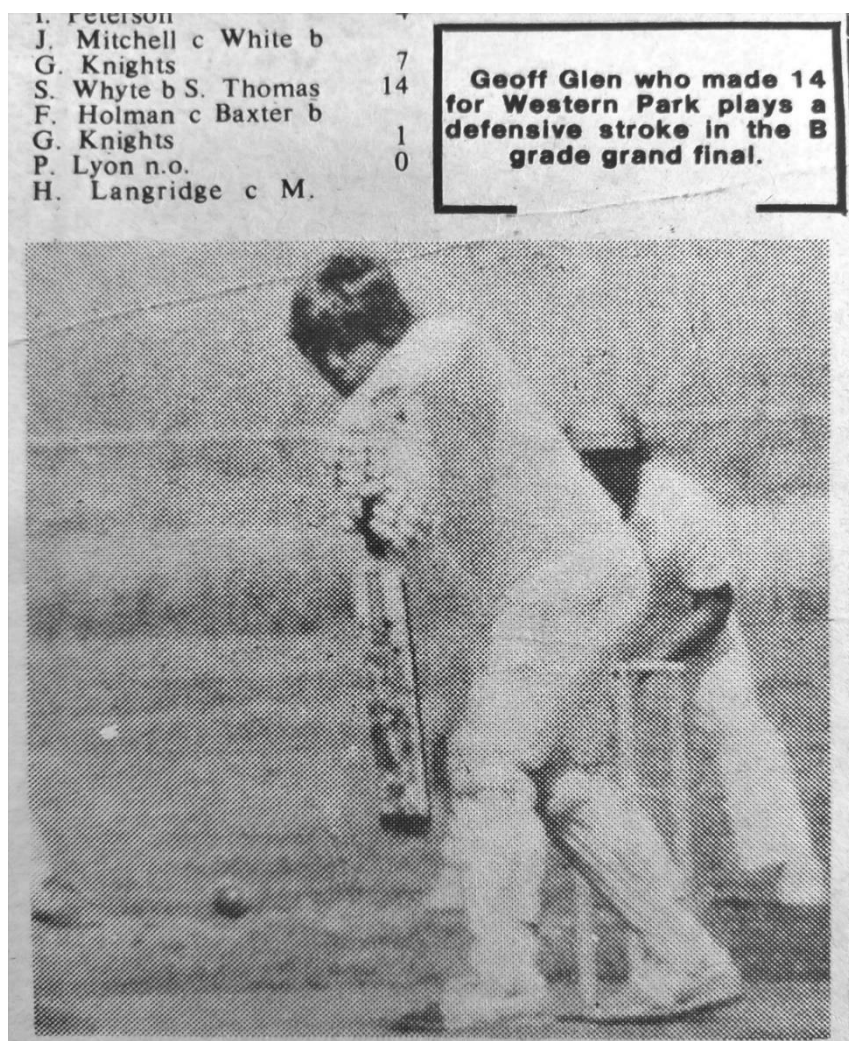

From the Gazette: "When Garfield-Bunyip batted a whole weekend for 449, it was one short of the Association's highest score record. Western Park replied with the new Association record highest score of 8/455 after batting all last weekend. The match aggregate of 904 runs is an all-time WDCA record for a two-innings match. Four batsmen making centuries in a two-innings match is also probably a record. It is believed that the seventh wicket partnership of 213 by Peter Ross and Ian Glen is a record.

It was Western Park Cricket Club's first premiership and Laurie Pitt's first as a team captain. Slow bowler George Purton, who did not get to have a hit, played in his first premiership team after 28 years in cricket. It was a disappointing result for Garfield-Bunyip to lose after making the third highest score in WDCA history.

Chasing 449, Western Park lost 3/47 and recovered to be 6/209 at the end of play on Saturday with Peter Ross 33 n.o. and Ian Glen n.o. 4. A rash supporter gave a Western Park player a side interest wager of \$200 -1. Imagine his thoughts as the score rose to 7/413 before Ross went for a brilliant 150... George Nuttall joined Glen and immediately went for runs with 37 still needed and three wickets in hand.

This pair passed the Garfield-Bunyip tally and finally Glen – after making his maiden century – was stumped for 100 by Paul Dawes off George Vittiritti, the regular keeper. Vittiritti, a century maker for Garfield-Bunyip, gave the wicket-keeping gloves to Dawes when Western Park were recovering on Saturday through Rohan Glen (86) and Bruce Osbourne (42). He finished with 4/67 off 20 overs to emerge as Man-of-the-Match. Garfield-Bunyip, who had their club wind-up on Saturday night, could not believe the part fate played on them the next day. Leading by 246 with only four tail-end batsmen to dismiss, they could not believe that Western Park only lost one of those wickets in getting the necessary runs. Regular keeper Geoff Carland missed the final due to an injury in the final home match when struck above the left eye by a rearing delivery. He was home from the Eye and Ear Hospital and Sunday's win has assisted his recovery."

"This year saw the culmination of many years of hard work by our players and committee to finally achieve the magical premiership, our first under our new name of WPCC. Our premiership win will create interest and talk for many years to come, because it was the way it was achieved that was memorable. Nobody will ever take away the finals experience gained over six days by many of our younger players who will now approach their cricket in a different manner and direct the club through the 1980's.

I used 28 players this season, the most pleasing aspect being not the quantity of players used, but the quality and consistency of each player. This has been my ultimate goal since taking over as Team Captain; to develop the depth of the side to No. 11. This theory was proven in the Grand Final. In conclusion my thanks to all concerned, from Graeme Hogan (our hardworking president), all Committee members, and of course the players whose dedication and support enabled us all to experience a memory that we will never forget and to set the path for the club to achieve much improved results in years to come."

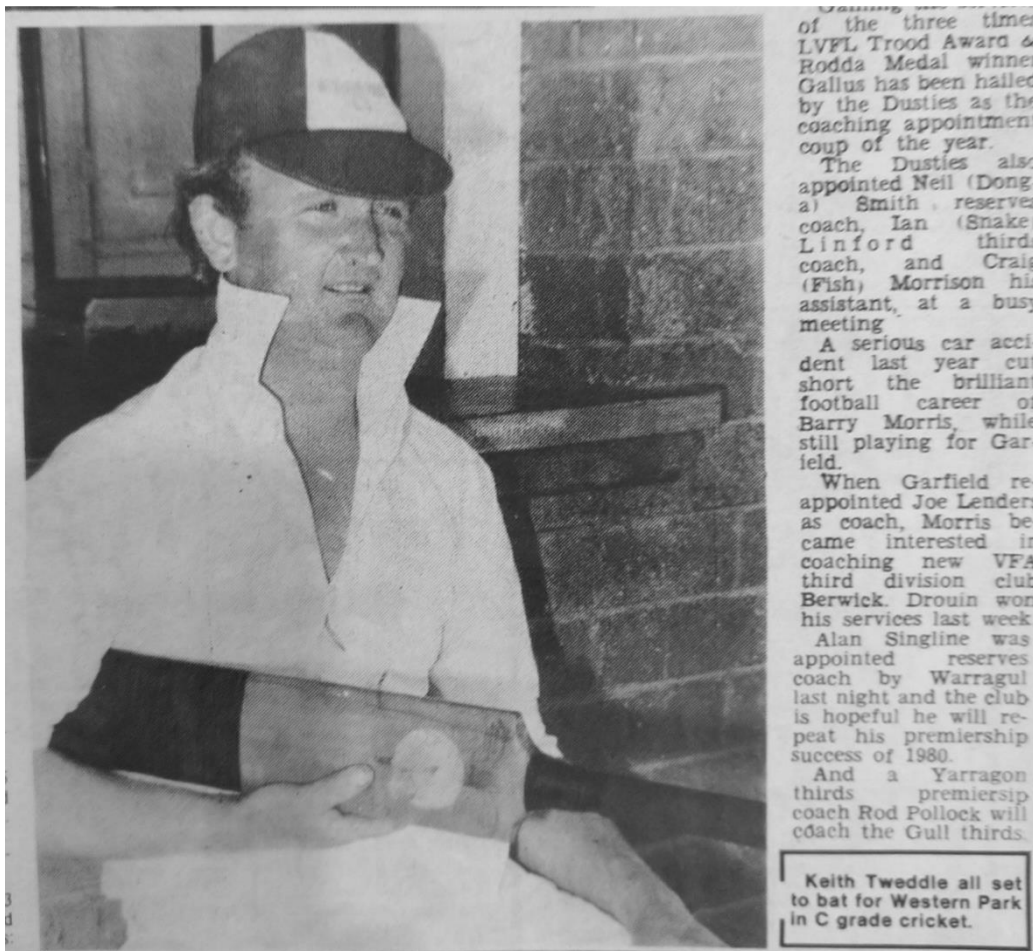

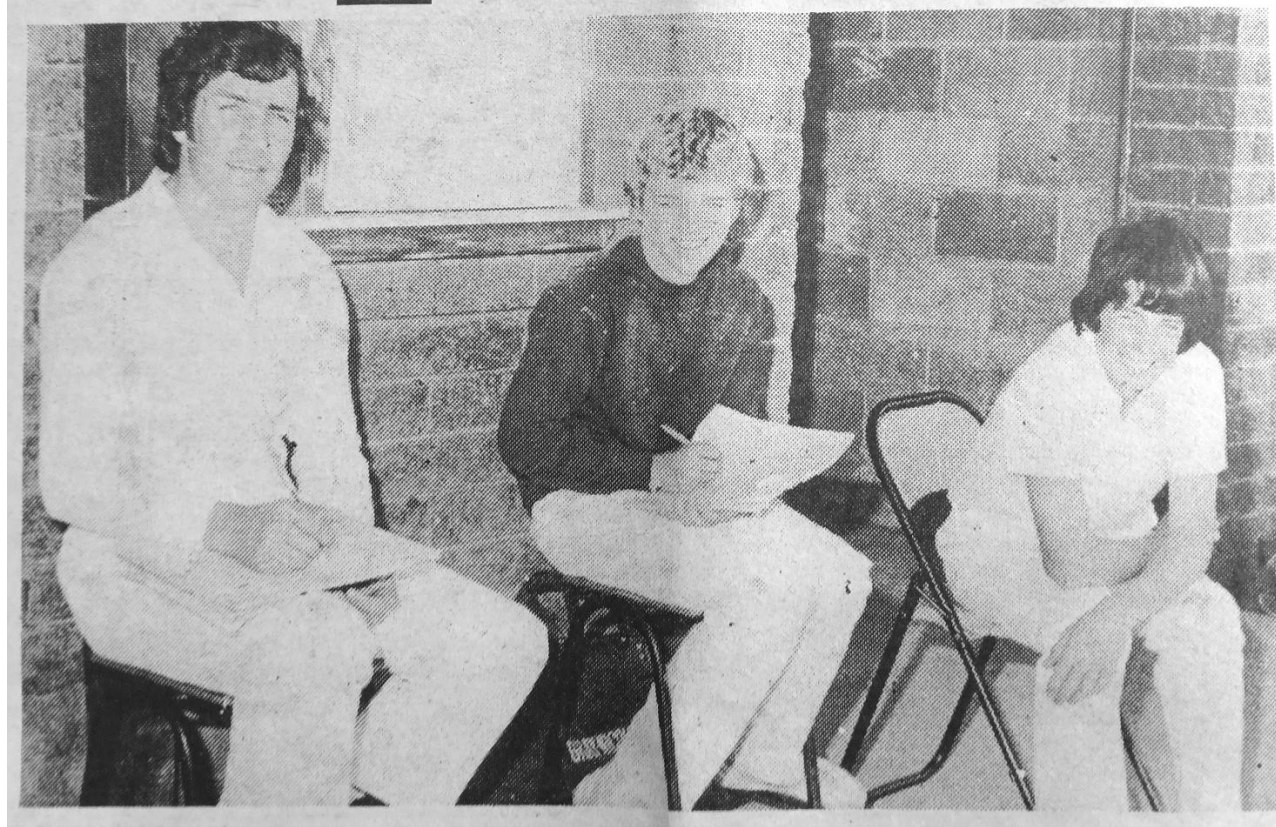
