Off-Season News

WDCA Report – From the Trader: “The 1990-91 Warragul and District Cricket Association season will start on Saturday October 13. The draw committee felt that it had no option but to move to the second Saturday in October to avoid clashing with the AFL Grand Final on October 6. There will still be twenty scheduled playing days of cricket as per usual, with the home-and-away season finishing on March 2, 1991. A, B, and C-Grade will play nine two-day games and two one-day games whilst D-Grade will play 19 one-day games. The junior draw hasn’t been finalised yet due to the uncertainty of some clubs’ ability to field a team.”

WDCA Update – From the Trader (October 11th): “Round One of WDCA cricket will be played this Saturday. The draw committee has made some changes to the draw published a few weeks ago, and the correct draw on the broadsheet format will be available to clubs very soon. The Yarragon Cricket Club has started work on its second ground, but it won’t be played on for some time yet, and Western Park’s main oval should be ready by October 27th. The same ten teams make up A-Grade this year while B-Grade has 12 teams, and C and D-Grade both have eight teams.”

From the Gazette: “Inclement weather once again greeted Warragul and District cricketers on Saturday, but it was nowhere near as bad as the week before. Nilma Dusties versus Western Park was the only A-Grade game that had started the week before. Western Park resumed at 6/149 and declared at 9/208. The best of the batsmen on the day was Peter Croft (44 n.o.) while for Nilma Dusties, three bowlers took a wicket each on the second day.

Nilma Dusties got off to a disastrous start losing two wickets for only one run with both wickets being taken by Paul Hughes. Andrew Dalrymple (59) and Graeme Rankin (60) then got going and put on a very good 104-run partnership, and this was followed by another good partnership. John McGrath batted very well to make 58 runs, but the Dusties ran out of time and although making 6/203 they could only come away with a draw. 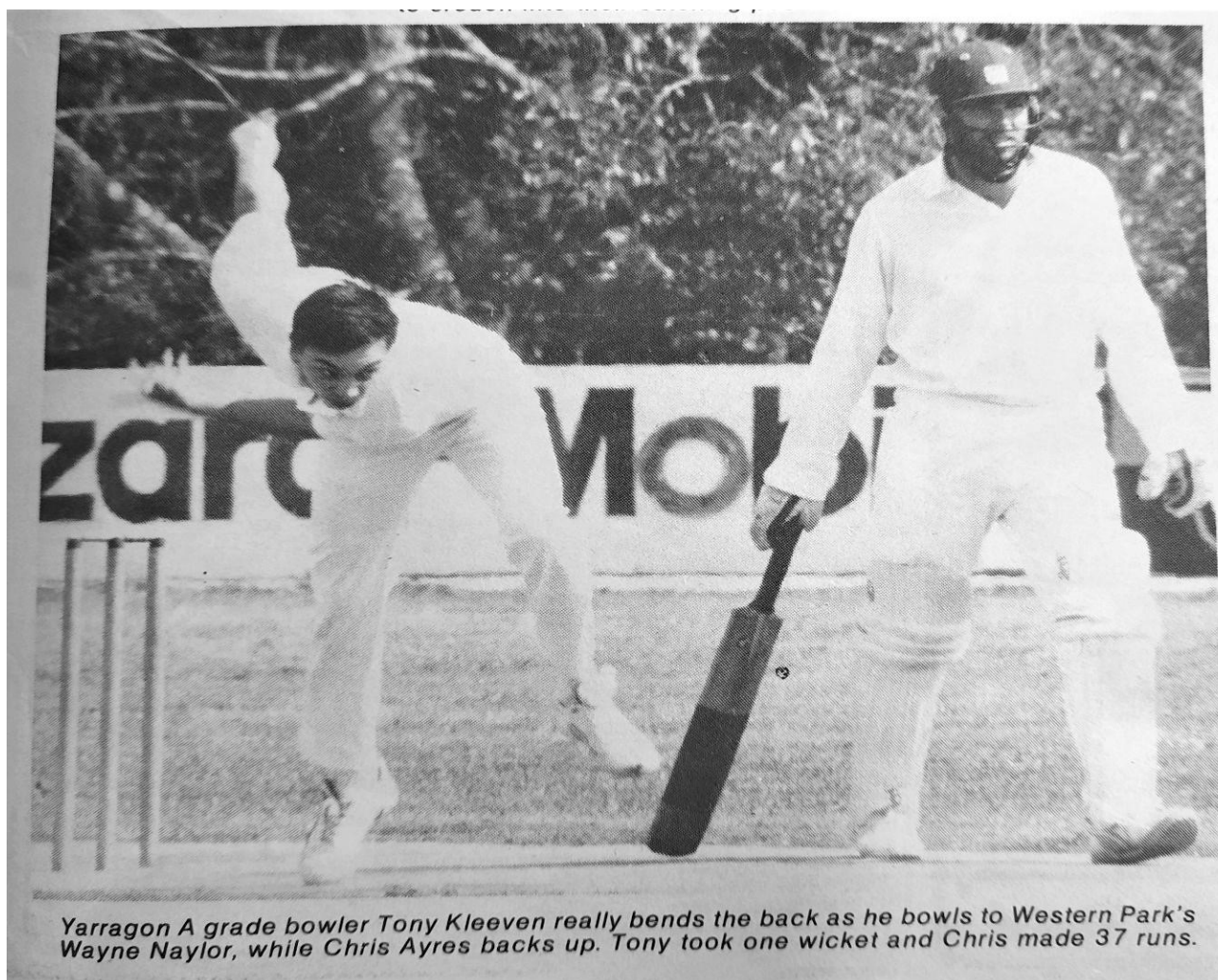

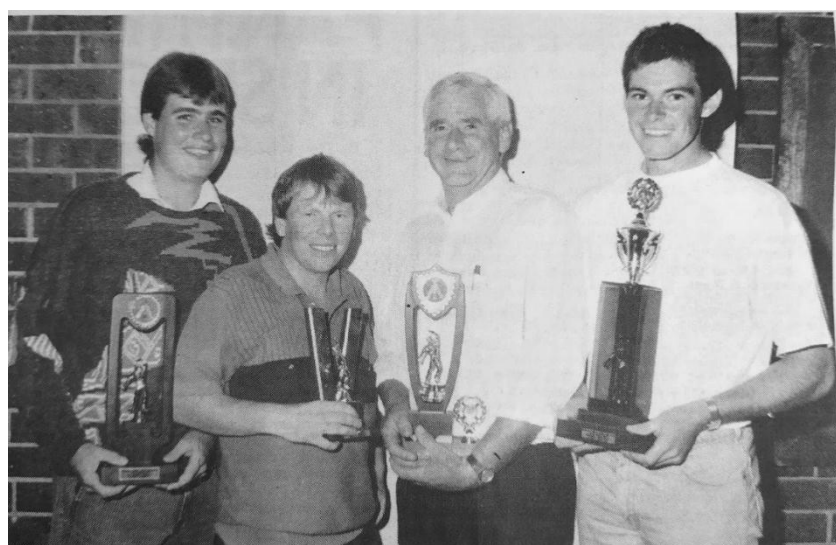
