New format for WDCA?

The Warragul and District Cricket association tabled a two tiered A/B grade competition at its recent annual general meeting.

The format has been on the drawing board for more than six months, but it was not until the trial draw was tabled that a club resisted.

Division one consists of eight clubs with A/B and the second tier with 6/7 or eight clubs with A/B in division two and then either a C and D combined to form a C grade or C and D as they were last season.

Division one would include the eight teams who finished highest on the ladder at the end of last season in the old (A) grade competition, which were Buln Buln, Warragul, Western Park, Trafalgar, Haliora, Garfield, Drouin, and Yarragon.

The coming season draw would consist of 21 days of seven two day matches and seven one day matches.

Division two would include Ellinbank, Iona, Longwarry, Bunyip, Neerim District, Jindivick, Nilma Darnum, Dusties and maybe one other club who would also play 21 days of cricket including seven two day matches and seven one day matches.

After the first year premiers in division two would replace the bottom side in division one.

President Ron Harper said there were many advantages.

He said it would be easier to construct a draw because when A grade plays at home B grade would play away.

It would allow younger players to gain more experience with a four piece cricket balls and come under scrutiny for higher standard representative cricket games for either region seven or WDCA.

"Representative U15, U16, U18 and U21s all play with four-piece balls and in the association at the moment we have Bunyip, Longwarry, Jindivick and Neerim District that have some talented juniors that never get the chance to practice with a four piece balls unless playing representative cricket for the WDCA," Mr Harper said.

"This would allow these clubs to retain their juniors by giving them a game against better players with four piece balls instead of moving to clubs that have an A grade side.

"There have been instances in the past where junior players have gone to other clubs because their club has not had an A grade side.

"Bunyip for example have got a lot of good young up

and coming junior cricketers and if they wish to play at a higher standard of cricket then they would have to leave their club to do this.

"If they do not go then the chance of playing at a higher standard and pursuing personal improvement maybe missed.

At the moment Bunyip go nowhere if they win a premiership, unless two sides move up from B grade. This could place an unwanted strain on a club who are not ready for A grade cricket.

"The only other option is to have a bye and the ramifications of that are huge on both administrators and the players in the elite competition.

If a club promotes itself and shows all the junior players that good performances will see them coming under scrutiny for playing representative cricket and it would even allow their club to move up a division if they win the premiership, they will continue to stay at that club.

This has worked in the rebuilding of cricket in England where they have had a two-tiered competition for about three years.

Mr Harper said selectors of representative sides would be instructed to pick teams from both divisions, thus opening the door for the clubs that used to field their highest side in the old B grade competition.

The opportunity will be there for any elite players from any club to play representative cricket for the association.

It will also encourage clubs to play more cricket and will see them play each other twice in both formats of the game (one day and two days) making it an even competition.

Clubs will not be able to stack their lower sides with elite players later in the season to win premierships because they will have to win games in the higher division to avoid relegation.

This new format will make the administering of the draw and printing of the handbook more efficient as these tasks can be completed before the start of the season.

Mr Harper said changes were difficult but the association was not trying to move clubs elsewhere, they were trying to get more cricketers playing at a higher standard. "This may take a year or two, and there are still a few issues to be sorted out with some clubs, but once this has been done the WDCA will make its final decision," he said.

Restructured Cricket Competition Promises Best Season Ever – from the Gazette (by Gary Donoghue):

"The 2004/05 season is just one week away and this season is sure to be one of the biggest and most exciting that we have seen for a long time. A new format has created a much more even competition and with this the door opens for all teams to have a real crack at winning the title in their respective divisions. Clubs like Warragul and Drouin will lose much of the dominance they have held over previous years while clubs like Longwarry and Bunyip will become forces to reckon with over the next few seasons. It certainly makes for a great year in local cricket

Western Park: The arrival of former Neerim South premiership player and Country Week Representative Bret Thompson as Captain/Coach adds some real sting to this Western Park outfit. He is a fiery opening bowler and handy lower order batsman who will make sure his presence is felt by any opposing team. They also welcome back John Pollard after stints at Trafalgar and Springvale.

He returns to the club where he was a major contributor to the side which won the 1997/98 A-Grade Premiership. An excellent top order batsman and two-time club batting average winner, he is a dangerous prospect for all bowlers and when you add the likes of Danny Sheehan and Matt Wakefield to the list, Western Park look a class outfit. Chris O'Hare is a youngster who must take the next step up. A promising batsman who scored an unbeaten century in last year's B-Grade Grand Final – and also claimed four wickets – he will be put through the test and blooded into the top level in just his second year of senior cricket.

With the retirement of his father Paul, Alex Gavin will also be another player to have a shot at the top level, with the incentive of claiming the number one wicket-keeping position at the club. In the 2nds, the experience of Chris Ayres and Alan Cusden will play a major role in the team's success for season 2004/05, both are leaders at the club and will hold the key to the development of their side.

The Verdict: Western Park look like an extremely formidable outfit and will be able to challenge strongly for the first division title. They have a lot of young talent coming through which means the club will just keep getting better and better. They also have some very experienced players who are not past their best just yet. This club should finish the season with a premiership to their name, but in just which division will the glory be claimed?

Hallora: Hallora are a side on the hunt for a premiership, make no doubts about it, they are in it to win it! They welcome Kevin Murphy – a wicket-keeper batsman with English first-grade experience (played with the Devon CC for 15 seasons) and his talent and experience will give the Hallora side the type of boost they have been requiring for the last couple of seasons. Once again Mark and Simon Phillips, along with Dave and Grant Williams, hold much of the responsibility with both bat and ball. These players must have good seasons if Hallora are to make the type of inroads into the competition they are looking for. Young Owen Sheedy – who had his fair share of chances in A-Grade last season – is a player the club believes is developing quite nicely. A left-hand batsman who is able to bat for long periods of time, last season against Western Park he batted for 60 overs and scored 46 runs – certainly a player who could create a long day for the bowlers! In the 2nds, Alby Smethurst and John Galletta will hold much of the responsibility in creating a much more consistent and stable batting line-up, while it's hard to see where their wickets will come from.

The Verdict: Hallora will challenge strongly for the first division title, but as with most small clubs they appear to lack a lot of depth – particularly in the bowling department. It's hard to see their second and third side's really challenging for a final's spot.

Iona: The Iona Cricket Club has had little to celebrate on the field in its short history and last year was certainly a season they would like to forget. This season with a new league structure and club structure, Iona are talking up their chances of finals cricket in at least two of the three divisions. Michael Taylor will continue as Club Coach and Captain of the 1sts, his relentless attacking cricket with both bat and ball will be vital in helping Iona taste success this season. The club welcomes Gavin Bailey – a batsman/fast bowler who was Captain/Coach of Morwell for two seasons, and also Vice-Captain of their GCL representative side. Andrew Davidson and Craig Byrnes are two players who must stand up and be counted for Iona if they are to play finals cricket.

In the 2nds, Phil Medley and Michael Neilson hold the key with the new ball, Gary Donoghue also must have a good season with the ball if Iona are to be competitive, whilst the experience and dependability of Bob Rogers with the bat will hold the key in the middle order. Luke Ferguson is Iona's young player to watch. His development with both bat and ball has been remarkable over the pre-season. He will probably start the season in the 2nds.

The Verdict: Iona has the right mix of players to make them good enough to earn a finals spot, but I wouldn't expect them to come home with a flag just yet.

Drouin: Drouin are a team with many experienced campaigners and plenty of young talent, boasting four senior teams this season they are one of the clubs to beat. John Perry has been appointed captain of the 1st side – which on paper is a classy outfit – the return of David Sharpe from a shoulder injury is a huge boost. He is a sensational batsman capable of taking the attack up to any good bowling opposition, [is] also a fine fielder, and just as good as wicket-keeper if placed behind the stumps. Clinton Proctor – who had a great season last year – will again be on the hunt for runs and wickets, and the development of young fast bowler Blair Weller will again be vital in helping the side get off to a good start with the ball.

Throw Ben Thomson, Trevor Gardiner, and Dale Thomas into the mix and the abundance of young talent is blatantly obvious. Drouin have two sides in the s2nds and will be hoping at least of those will taste success. The bowling combination of Michael Caddy and Rhys Gouge will hold the key to the 1st of the 2nd teams' success, whilst in the 2nd side Justin Hill and George Lindorff – who are both more than handy with bat and ball – will have large roles to play in their side.

The Verdict: Drouin are a very formidable outfit but whether they are capable of going all the way in their respected division's remains to be seen. The 1sts are in with a shot but whether or not their young blood has the ability to withstand the pressure of finals is what will determine how they travel at the end of the season.

Trafalgar: Trafalgar continue to enjoy much success of the field with the redevelopment of their clubrooms and the installation of a new wicket, but the club would feel it's time to match that success and take it onto the field. The return of John Asmussen – fresh from a year off – will be a big boost for the Trafalgar batting stocks, along with Christian Burgess, another former player who has returned home and is also a very talented batsman. Along with the two returning players Trafalgar also has the likes of the experienced Graeme Rankin, Garry Edwards, and Andrew Dubelaar to help pile on the runs. Craig Nielsen and Robbie Mrzygloski will be very important with the ball and are the most likely to make inroads into opposition batting attacks. In the 2nds, Neil Rankin and Alan Blaser will hold much of the key, particularly with the bat, while David Bourke will hold much of the responsibility with the ball. All-rounder Neil Grimshaw will be the cornerstone in the 3rds and his contribution will be vital to the teams' success.

The Verdict: Trafalgar have gained two strong batsman in their 1st team and I think this may be enough to help them challenge for finals. They are one of the hot favourites for the 3rd's title in my book – plenty of experienced campaigners who are capable of taking the game by the scruff of the neck.

Bunyip: Bunyip are a developing side who have many talented junior players. This season will be an important one for the club and the return of Scott Squires is sure to help the team's development over the next couple of seasons. They also welcome Leigh Robinson from Croydon North – a handy bowling all-rounder – who will get a good chance to shine in the 1st XI. Michael Whyte will taste his first full season of senior cricket, a good junior cricketer who the club will be keen to develop as a strong middle order batsman. Ben Ross is another who Bunyip hopes will take the next step up and perform well for the 1st XI. Zack Jacobs is a very good spin bowler who will be very important for the club this season; he should get a chance in the 1st XI. In the 2nds, the left-hand batting of David Bracken will be a pivotal factor in the side's success.

The Verdict: Bunyip is a club set on developing their young talent, the new system should help them achieve this and, in a few seasons, they will be a dangerous prospect. They will be a team to watch but I doubt that premierships would be on the cards just yet.

Nilma Darnum: A lack of player numbers has forced Nilma Darnum into fielding just one senior team this year. Ben Majcherzak has been appointed as captain and will lead a very formidable side. Hayden Smart is definitely their most dangerous player – he scored 310 runs and took 23 wickets last season – and Brad Heeps is another who had a successful season last year taking 36 wickets – the best in the league! They have [also] recruited well. Stuart Forrest looks a handy cricketer, Craig Fricke and Matt Heeps are also looking to return and help out the struggling club.

The Verdict: A very strong side, what they lack in numbers they make up with talent and experience. They will compete strongly in their league and are sure to cause plenty of headaches for their opposition.

Buln Buln: After a fantastic season last year Buln Buln will be keen to show once again that they are the number one team in the competition. There has been little change to the side that won last year's A-Grade Premiership apart from the appointment of Shaun Litaize as Captain-Coach, he will be assisted by opening bowler Jeff Walsh – who will be keen to continue the formidable alliance he struck with fellow bowler Ian Berry last season. WDCA Cricket of the Year Brent Eastwell will be looking forward to another big season; hopefully he can put on many good performances for his side and be a big factor in the team's success. Buln Buln have plenty of young bokes who are developing well and will be important for the club's chances. Nick Hasan is a young all-rounder with plenty of potential, Brad Peters was dominant with the ball for most of the season in the 2nd's last year, and Matt Harvey will be looking to make inroads with his ever-improving leg-spinners.

The Verdict: Buln Buln has a tough assignment. It's always hard defending a title and they will feel the pressure. I believe they have the talent to go back-to-back; it's just a matter of whether they believe that they can do it!

Yarragon: An aging club who see developing their youth as a number one priority, a man who has been a success story for Yarragon is Tony Kleeven. He has played at the club since junior level and is now undertaking the responsibility of captaining the senior team. He is a left-arm opening bowler and holds the record for highest individual wickets at the club. John Allsop is a regular GCL representative and is another who holds the key for Yarragon, he is a very good all-rounder and must have a good season if Yarragon are to make themselves a threat to the opposition. Young Daniel Hamilton should feature regularly in the 1st XI this season which will also be his first full year of senior cricket, a specialist batsman who won the U-16 GCL Player of the Year last season. Mick Bush will captain the 2nd XI, his class with both bat and ball will be vastly important this season. Paul Harvey – like Bush – is another young player who is always improving, a middle-order batsman who is capable of piling on the runs. The left-arm pace of John Buckland and the formidable batting of Steve Green will hold much of the responsibility of creating good starts with both bat and ball for Yarragon 3rd's XI.

The Verdict: Yarragon are a team setting the right goals. Player development is an important factor for any club, their hard work over the past years may well come to fruition this season and I believe they have a great opportunity to make the finals in all three grades.

Longwarry: The Longwarry 1sts are certainly the team to beat in their division. They welcome back Glenn Pask – a premiership captain-coach last season with Buln – his outstanding ability with the ball and handy batting will be a welcome addition to an already strong line-up. Luke Serong is another who looks to be making a return to his former club, a jack-of-all-trades, he can bat, bowl, and wicket-keep, making him a more than handy player for the club. Dale Serong enjoyed a good season last year, his most notable performance a double-century in a one-day match Unfortunately back problems plagued him for much of the season and he will be hoping that the time off has rejuvenated him and prepared him for the season ahead. The leg-spin of veteran Bob Thomas will also be very important for Longwarry, an old trickster who is sure to take plenty of wickets along with mean fast bowler Aaron Thomas who will be hungry to claim plenty of scalps with the ball. The development of youngsters Tye Holland – a batsman-wicket-keeper – and Brad Thomas – as an ever-improving fast bowler – will also be vital to Longwarry's success now and long into the future.

The Verdict: A very talented side whose 1sts are the favourites to claim the title in their division. A growing club who are looking to improve their players so that they are ready to take the next step when required.

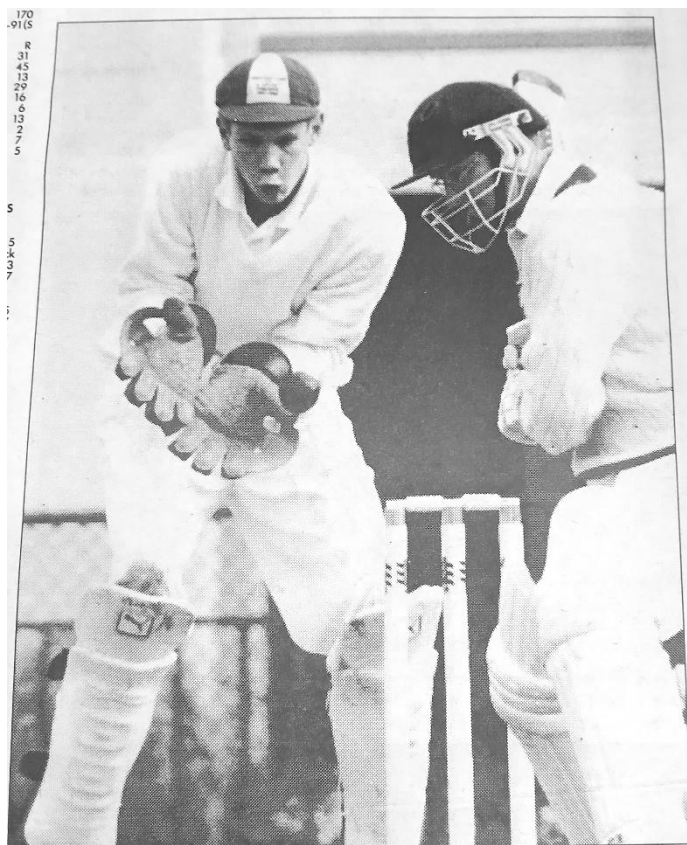

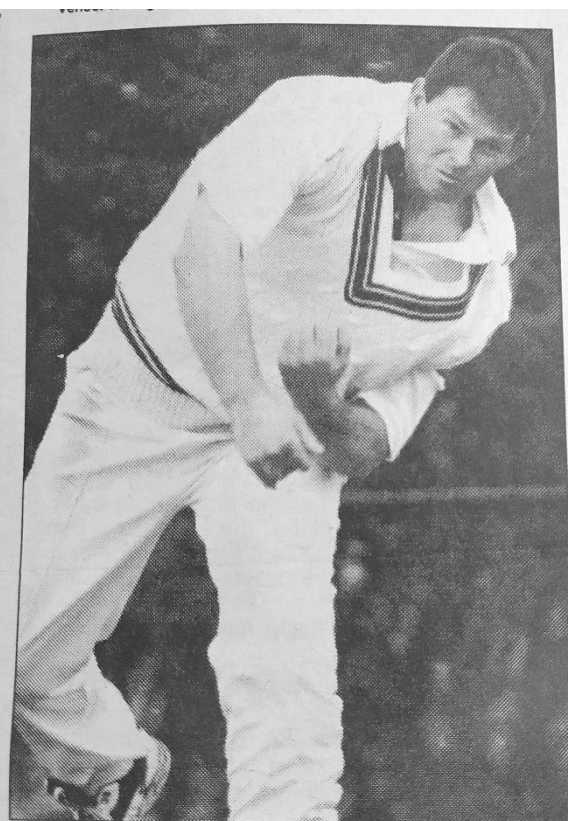

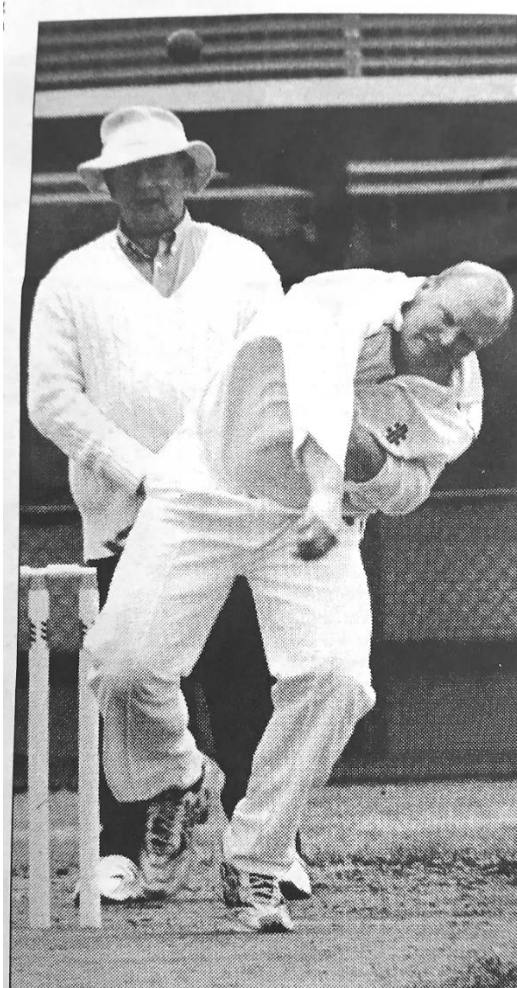

From the Gazette (by Gary Donoghue): "Garfield and Western Park have played out an absolute epic with Western Park snatching victory in the final over of the day. Garfield batted first and the start couldn't have been much worse with Brett Thompson claiming three wickets in one over to finish with figures of 3/53 and having the scorecard reading 3/9. Bernard Marson (22) and Peter Harper (25) steadied the Garfield innings but it was Doug Earwicker who placed Garfield in a winning position, belting a superb 55 to lead Garfield to a total of 8/154. Western Park also pulled off three run-outs, which is a fantastic effort, and prevented Garfield from scoring a couple more valuable runs.

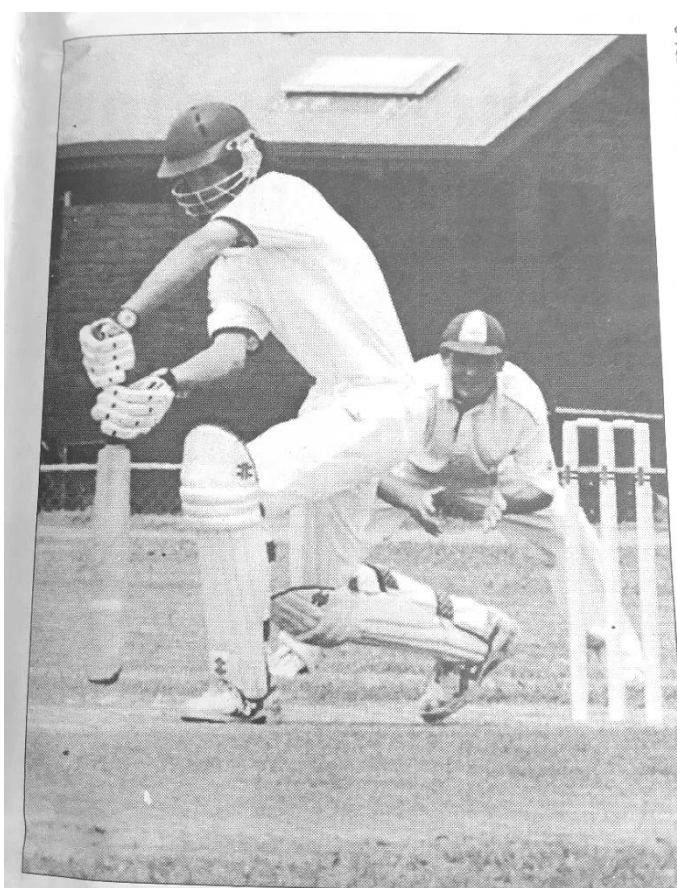

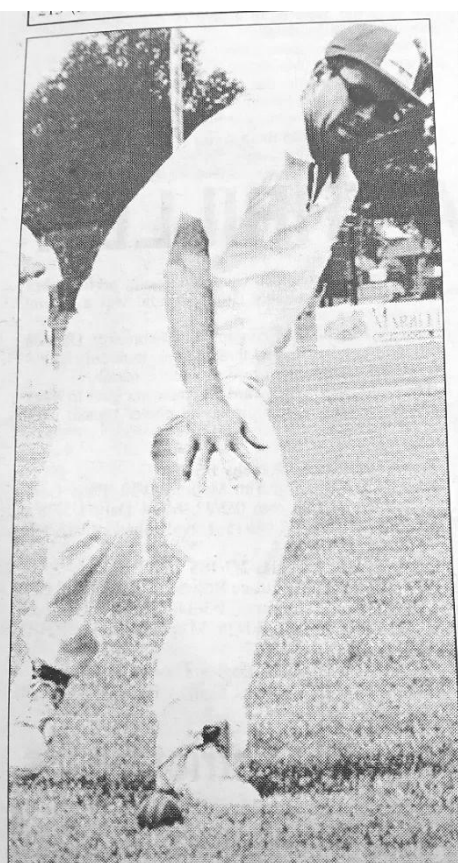

Warragul division one A grade batsman Kale Watkins plays a defensive shot as Western Park fielder Danny Sheehan anticipates a catch.

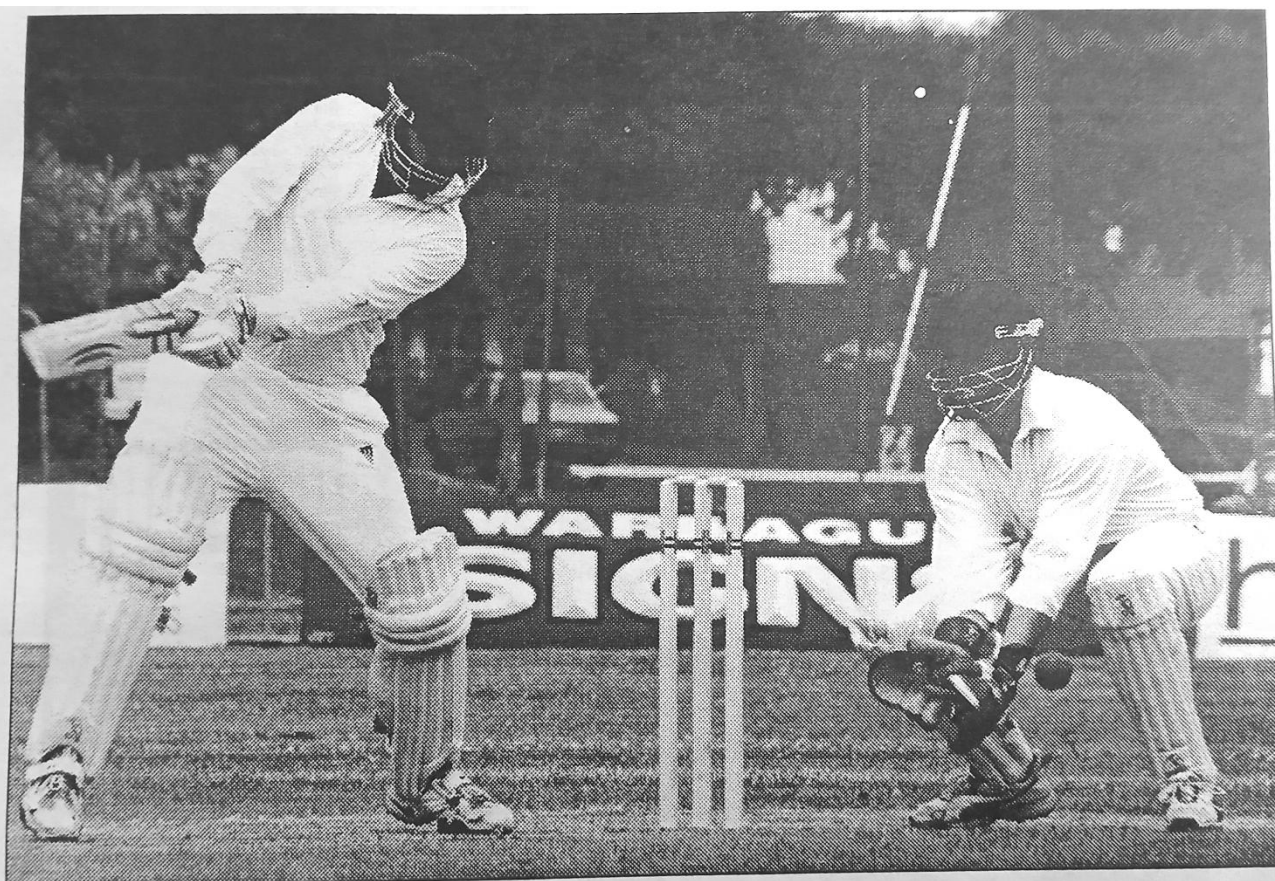

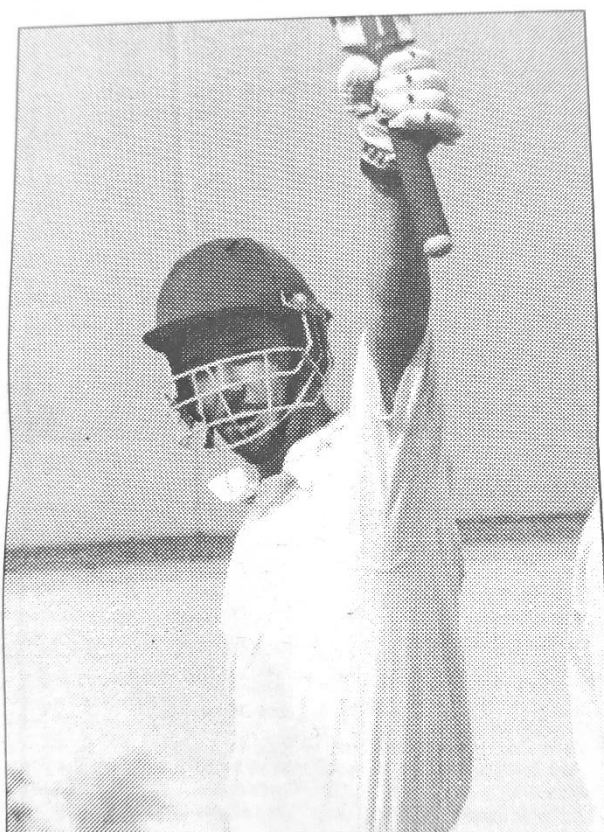

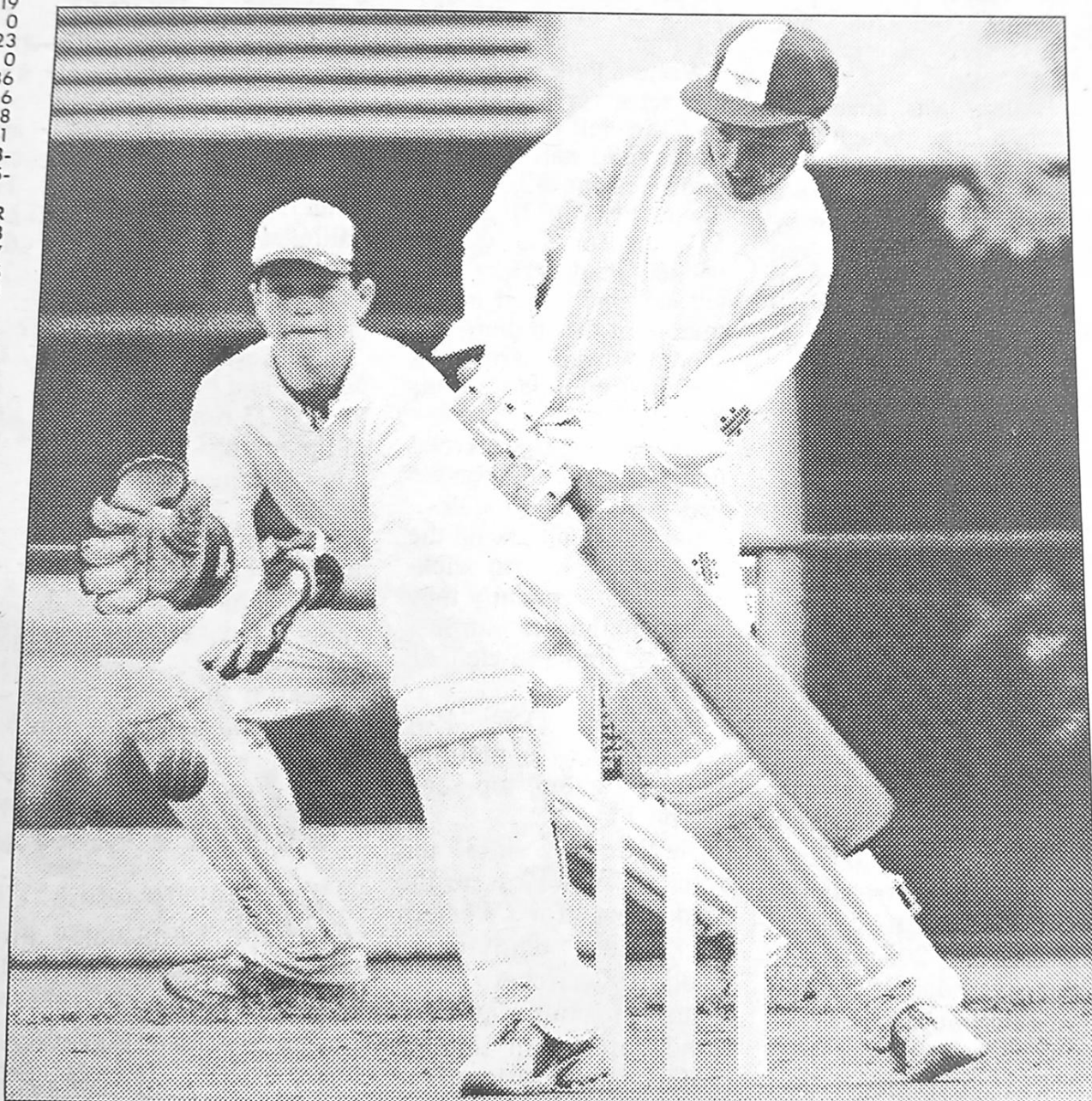

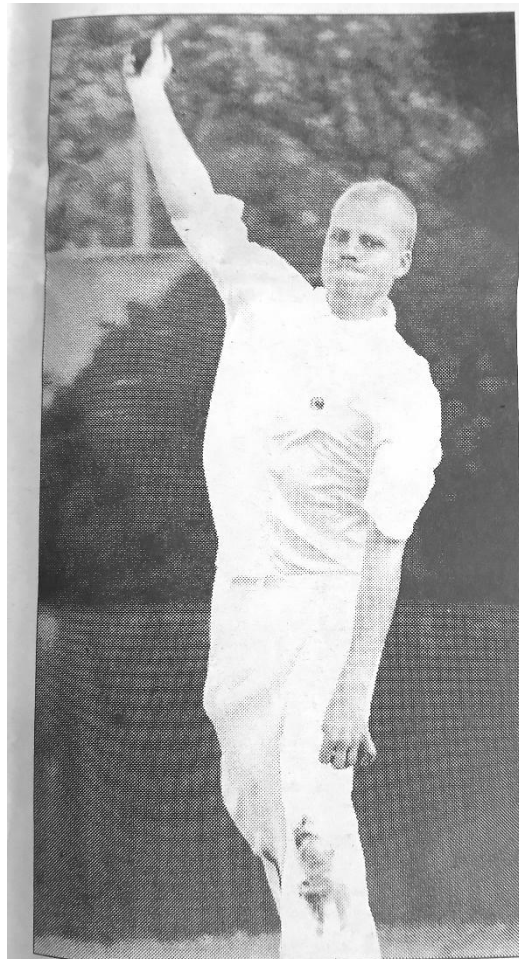

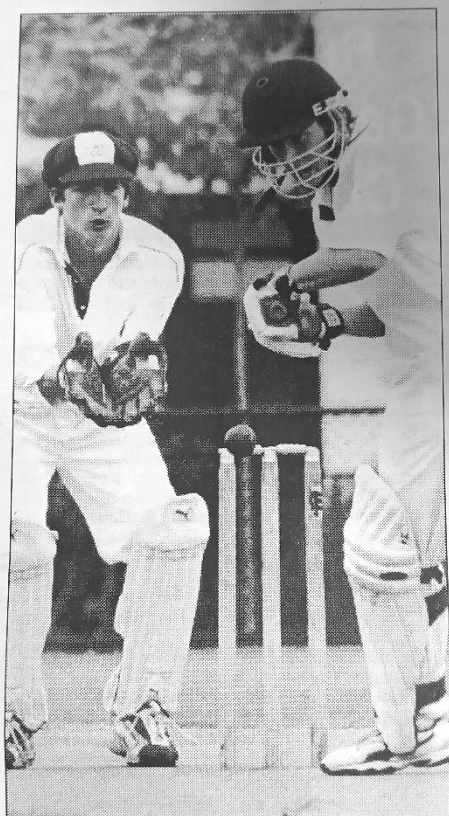

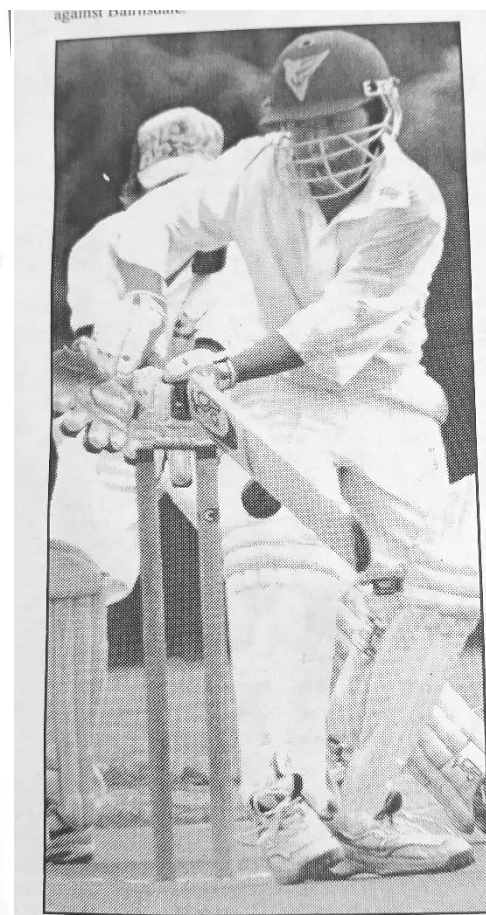
