WDCA to launch season on Monday

The Warragul and District Cricket Association is holding a grand opening to season 2001/02 at Western Park next Monday at The Western Park Oval.

It has been made compulsory for all 15 WDCA club presidents and secretaries to attend this night which they were notified of by mail.

The night commences at 5.45pm in the Warragul Football Club social rooms at Western Park.

The WDCA is hopeful of having a VCA and/or TCA cricketer in attendance on the night where they are also introducing their first ever major sponsor in Nicho's Mega Sports, Peter Nicholson.

A pitch inspection will be conducted firstly where the Western Park curator will show of the new centre wicket area that was laid back in March this year.

After one season of football on it, it is hoped that it will be up and running by November 3 where Western Park plays Buln Buln in a one day game in A grade.

Both clubs may even agree to play it on Sunday November 4 so that all other A grade players can view the first game from the sidelines.

It has become normal practice to play a season of football before playing cricket on turf wickets, which is what Traralgon did at the showgrounds a couple of years ago.

The WDCA will also be introducing its new umpire's co-ordinator Jason Walters, who will be supervising them from the sidelines.

Two new media officers from the Droyin Regional College will be attending also. Trevor Gardiner and Gary O'Donoghue will be introduced to all the clubs and the WDCA will be advising all clubs what they are expecting from them in assisting these

two in doing their job this season.

The new scorebooks, media sheets for seniors, juniors and under 12s will be presented to all clubs and if everything goes to plan the 2001/02 handbook with the draw could also be ready, but the following week is more likely.

It will be the first time that the new club office bearers will get to meet the new incoming executive members.

The season for A, B and C commences on October 6 while D, under 16 and under 14 starts the week after on October 13.

The under 12s will start on Wednesday October 31 and all clubs will receive the updated rules before the commencement of the season.

This year the executive committee has elected a GCL/country week co-ordinator.

Andrew Runnalls has taken on this task due to his commitment to four-

ing Australian Cricket tour of South Africa.

Remember that all interested people are most welcome to attend this opening. A light supper is being provided by the WDCA, so please pop along and have a chat and listen to what we hope will be the best ever year of WDCA cricket.

Don't forget that every Saturday morning from 9am to 10am from this Saturday Brian Sell will be on 3BBR 99.5FM as the WDCA local guru assisting Mark Glover and Mick Jungwirth in promoting local cricket.

Premiers Look Forward To New WDCA Season – *From the Trader (by 'The Newshound')*: "Reigning WDCA A-Grade premiers Western Park recently held their annual general meeting. Enthusiasm was the order of the day with the hunger for more success and excitement over the new turf wicket providing the impetus for some aging players and officials to approach the season with keenness not seen or felt for a long time. Major office bearers remain the same with Mark Freeman (President), Rod Breeden (Secretary), and Peter Croft (Treasurer). A number of other good people will fill committee positions.

Coach of three of the last four WDCA A-Grade premiers Paul Gavin will continue in the role this year, looking for back-to-back success. Paul is seen in some circles as somewhat of a cricket guru, a term which he seems to be coming more and more comfortable with. The club is looking at the possibility of fielding a second, mainly over-35s team (the first being the successful A-Grade team) in the one-day competition. Four senior teams is the goal, but this will be dependant on numbers and commitment from players...Sponsorship is more important than ever with the added cost of maintaining a turf wicket. The club is very thankful and supportive of current sponsors and is actively seeking more.

The turf wicket is the most exciting occurrence in local cricket for many years. The opportunity for local cricket to be on the same footing as neighbouring competitions is not just exciting but essential. The position of the WDCA as a member of the Gippsland Cricket League was far from guaranteed without it. To send cricketers – especially juniors – to represent our association at GCL and Country Week without turf experience was ludicrous. Western Park is hopeful that its brave move will be successful, ultimately seeing other clubs bite the bullet and install turf in coming years. A newly laid turf wicket certainly doesn't provide the ideal surface for football, but is a mound of dirt with water laying over a hard wicket against it any better?"

Western Park Cricket Club A NEW TURF WICKET

Exciting development in local cricket

A new era in WDCA cricket will begin this Sunday at Western Park when Buln Buln takes on the reigning premiers in the first game

on the newly laid turf wicket.

A good crowd is expected with most local cricketers keen to see how the new wicket plays.

The installation of the wicket is the most exciting occurrence and certainly the most progressive in local cricket for many years. The opportunity for local cricket to be on the same footing as neighboring competitions is not only exciting but essential.

The position of the WDCA as a member of the Gippsland Cricket League was far from guaranteed without it. WDCA representative teams have always been at a significant disadvantage at GCL and Country Week level with some players having absolutely no turf wicket experience. It is expected that the new wicket will make the already competitive representative teams even more successful in coming seasons.

Depending on how the wicket comes up this season's A grade grand final will be played at Western Park, a move which some say may turn out to be an advantage to the Western Park team.

Whilst this may be true, such an occurrence should only benefit local cricket to look at installing turf to nullify any perceived advantage to the Western Park team.

A traditionally wet Gippsland October has seen questions raised as to whether the wicket will be ready.

Curator Anthony Hibbs and the club volunteers who assist him have been very busy and with a little luck with the weather no problems are envisaged for Sunday's game.

A dream that began four or five years ago with a Saturday night discussion over a few beers will become a reality this Sunday. It is an absolute credit to those involved in that original discussion that they have followed through and done the hard yards to bring their dream to fruition.

Countless volunteer hours have gone into the project, with a generous grant from the Baw Baw Shire allowing the wheels to be set in motion for what many will witness this Sunday.

Turf Wickets Victoria was employed as consultants and the dream was underway. A number of hiccups saw early works behind schedule but the wicket finally went in before the football season.

Turf was laid and rye

grass sown immediately after the football season. Five wickets have been laid. The middle wicket will be used on Sunday.

Curator Anthony Hibbs has drawn up a wicket rotation plan, including GCL games. All five wickets will receive minimal usage this season.

The proposed grand final wicket will be used for only one game during the season to ensure it is in tip-top condition for what is the showpiece of WDCA cricket.

Whilst the grant from Baw Baw Shire was more than handy, costs of installing and maintaining the wicket are prohibitive. Without assistance from sponsors this project would not be possible.

Western Park CC is thankful for the support it received in this area and is very pleased to announce The Railway Hotel Warragul has joined Clark First National Real Estate as a major sponsor of the club.

Director of Clark First National Ian Clark, a local councillor and a Life Member of Western Park will toss the coin to begin proceedings.

Anyone with an interest in local cricket is encouraged to come along and witness what should be a most entertaining and certainly historic game of cricket.

Match preview

The big clash on Sunday should be a beauty with both sides boasting some fine players.

Western Park player profiles.

Rod Breeden: A dour left hand opening bat and right hand medium pace bowler who plays straight and may be well suited to the turf wicket.

Dale Fawcett: Left hand opening bat who lives for cricket and is usually kitted up and ready to play hours before his team mates.

Shaun Litaize: Exciting left hand bat who may need to temper his aggression on the new turf. Brilliant in the field.

Paul Gavin: Steady right hand top order batsman who puts real value on his wicket when playing top grade cricket. Very good wicket keeper.

Matt Wakefield: Aggressive young right hand bat with exceptional talent. Capable wicket keeper.

Paul McCluskey: Right hand bat who is a good accumulator of runs. Can also wicket keep.

Brian McLean: Punishing right hand bat and accurate slow bowler. Exceptional slips fieldman.

Peter Croft: Veteran all-rounder. Right hand bat who values his wicket more than most. Spin or slow medium bowler and specialist gully fieldman.

Alan Cusden: Aggressive right hand bat and excellent seam bowler who's ability to move the ball off the pitch may see him included at the expense of McGrath.

Mick Roberts: Veteran right hand opening bowler and hard hitting late order bat. Has a real mear streak and is never beaten.

Paul Hughes: Former district cricket opening bowler who has slowed a lot but his experience on turf will make him hard to keep out. Can bat at either end of order.

Aaron McGrath: Young right hand quick bowler who has found consistency this season. Capable of making an impact if he gets the nod.

Buln Buln player profiles.

Andrew Best (Capt): Right arm change bowler and right hand middle order bat who has excelled since coming to Buln Buln.

Corey Jagoe (Vice Capt): Right hand top order bat and right arm medium pacer who can push the score along when required or break that partnership when needed.

Ian Berry: Right hand middle order bat right arm change bowler. Made his maiden century last year and has developed into a very handy first change bowler.

Daniel Best: Keeper right hand bat who when on song can make quick runs.

Brant Davidson: Left arm opening bowler and left hand middle/late bat. Can hit or caress his scores and is a very handy opening bowler who can dry the runs up when you most want it late in a innings.

Brent Eastwell: Right hand top order bat right arm bowler. Excelled at junior level. Made A century at 15, but has struggled due to injuries over

the past two years. First full season and has already made an impact with ball and bat.

Jeremy Jagoe: Left hand opening bat right arm change bowler. First full year in two years, made 44 in first hit against Trafalgar. Can break the partnership like his brother and can hold an innings together with the bat.

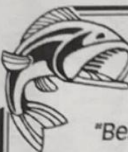
Anthony Nicholas: Right hand bat and bowler who has come to Buln Buln from Clifton Hills this year and has already made an impact.

Mick Pratt: Left arm spinner and right hand bat. Mick is still learning the tricks of the trade but has come on leaps and bounds since last year. Very good fielder who can create a run out with dead-eye throws.

Dale Serong: Right hand top order bat right arm bowler (spin or medium). Very talented cricketer who has power and elegance when batting, accumulates runs with ease and is an attacking bowler.

Greg Walsh: Right hand bat and keeper. Young keen player who will bat anywhere when asked. Excelled in juniors and is still finding his feet in the seniors, but shows signs of maturing in to a solid A grade player.

Jeff Walsh: Right arm opening bowler and right hand bat. Has had two stints at Dandenong but has now decided to give Buln the nod. Good young opening swing bowler who can get good lift out of any track.

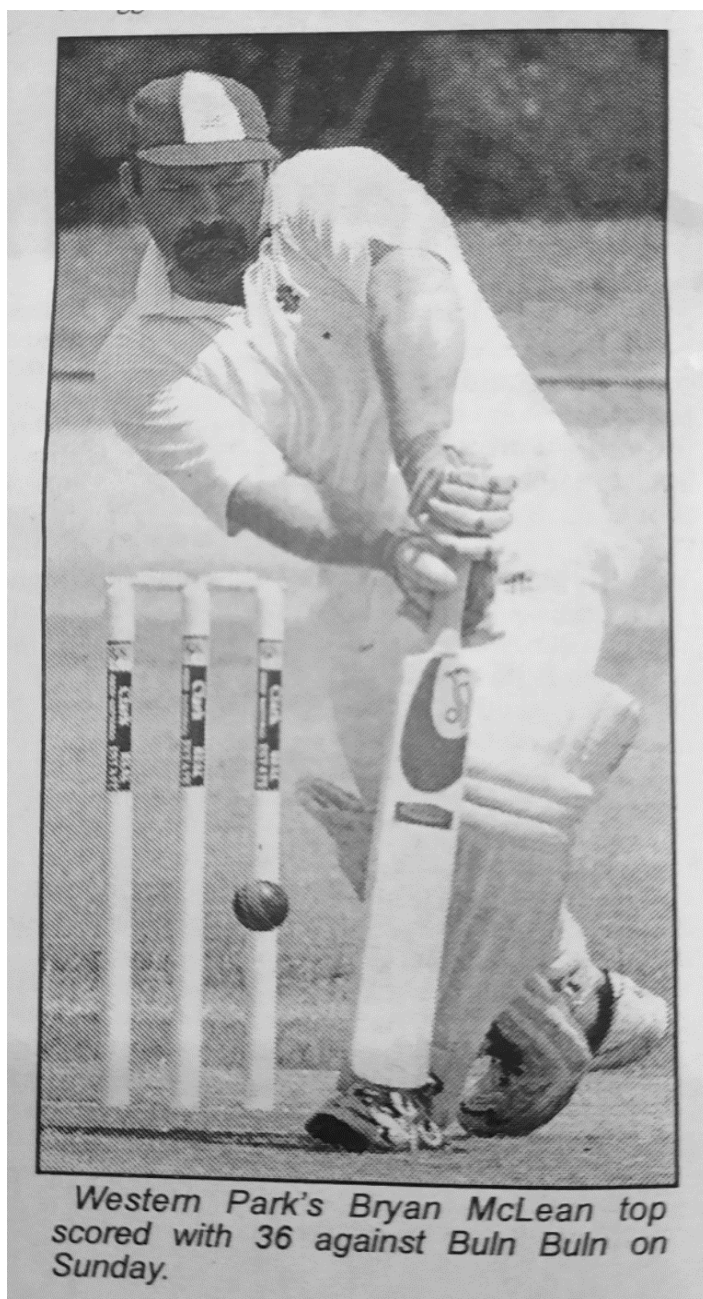

Well, they can breathe a lot easier now as the new turf wicket came through with flying colours. All the players who played from Western Park and Buln gave it the big thumbs up after the game and certainly has gotten some other clubs talking turf now. Curator Anthony Hibbs has certainly prepared a batting strip that will produce plenty of runs over the year as neither side could blame the wicket on any of their dismissals. Councillor and Western Park Life Member Ian Clark tossed the coin before a large crowd where Parkers captain Paul Hughes elected to bat first – a move I would also have done.

Runs on the board are always hard to get when you are unsure of what the wicket will do and on the day everyone was just that little unsure what they were going to get. The game started on time and Buln opened with Jeff Walsh and Brant Davidson, and neither could get the initial breakthrough but when Rod Breeden was run-out they made inroads quickly.

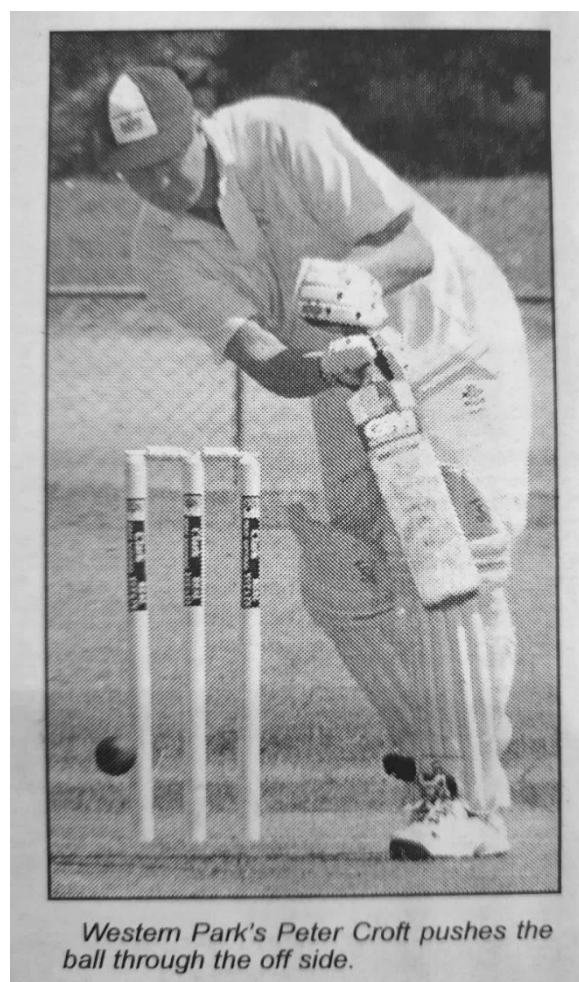


Mick Pratt took two wickets for 18, with the last being the stumping of Peter Croft who made 24. But, it was the way he was stumped [that stood out]. The ball ricocheted off the pads of Buln keeper Daniel Best onto the stumps while 'Crofty' was looking around for the ball. The catch of the day was the one-handed take by Buln captain-coach Andrew Best – he dived virtually at right angles to dismiss Paul Hughes at mid-off.

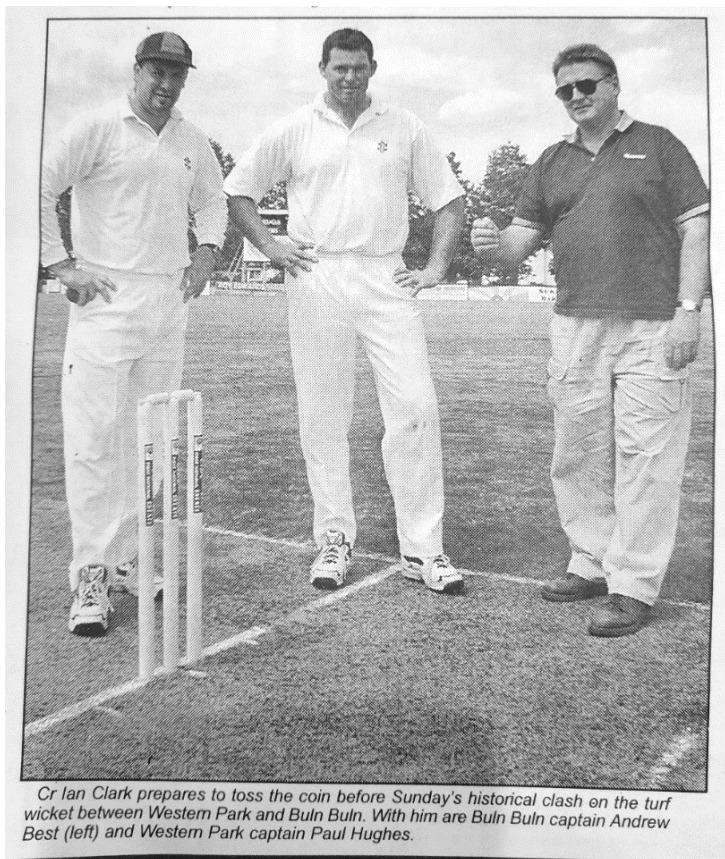
Brent Eastwell ended with two for 27 off his 10 overs while Jeff Walsh took 3/12. It was now whether Buln could match the strong bowling attack of Western Park chasing their 106. Paul Hughes got an early breakthrough when he bowled Anthony Nicholas, but that was to be their only joy early in the innings. Dale Serong and Jeremy Jagoe set about building a partnership and both looked comfortable before Rod Breeden bowled Dale. Dale looked as comfortable as Fawcett for Western Park and both showed that a big innings is just around the corner. Peter Croft came on and his tidy bowling turned the game back in Western Park's favour. Croft picked up Davidson, Jagoe, and Eastwell – three big wickets – and all three were looking dangerous when he got them out.

Jeff Walsh had Shaun Litaize LBW and soon after clean bowled the other dangerous man in Matt Wakefield and when Davidson bowled Paul Gavin around his legs Western Park were 4/17 in the 10th over. Last year's A-Grade batting average winner was soon on his way as well and at five-down the Parkers were looking shaky. Dale Fawcett and Bryan McLean set about restoring order, but Corey Jagoe made the breakthrough that again put them on the back-foot.

Fawcett departed for an elegant 26, which was full of some lovely pull shots and cover drives and certainly set the tone for a bigger score than they were looking at. The introduction of Brent Eastwell and Michael Pratt slowed things down but McLean's strong hitting saw him make a handy 36 before his departure.



Davidson fell to a low catch at cover when Alan Cusden dived forward, Jagoe was bowled, and Eastwell – who had cracked two thumping off drives for four – fell LBW. With eight overs to go, Eastwell – until out – had put the game back in Buln's favour, but when he fell the game swung back to the Parkers. The reintroduction of Paul Hughes and Mick Roberts saw them tie Buln up and when Corey Jagoe fell Buln still needed 40 runs. Ian Berry and Daniel Best were unable to bring Buln home as Hughes and Roberts dried the well.



Deserving winners Western Park, but they must get the top order in form. Litaize has shown form lately but if they are to beat Trafalgar this week they must get off to a good start. Buln lost its way during the middle part of its innings.

You can't always belt fours to get out of trouble. Western Park worked the ball around when in trouble, Buln simply didn't do this when they were tied up. They showed a lack of experience as they countlessly hit balls firmly to the fielders when all they had to do was use soft hands and run singles like Dean Jones and Mark Waugh. As youngsters they will learn a lot from this and I'm sure 'Besty' and the older ones around the club will be working on this at training for the game against Neerim District.

I congratulate the Western Park committee for a fantastic day and I congratulate them on all the hard work they have done over the past couple of months.

I also congratulate the curator Anthony Hibbs for the effort he has done to get this strip up and running. It is always nerve-wrenching waiting for that first day of play and playing on the Sunday certainly gave them that extra time they needed to prepare."

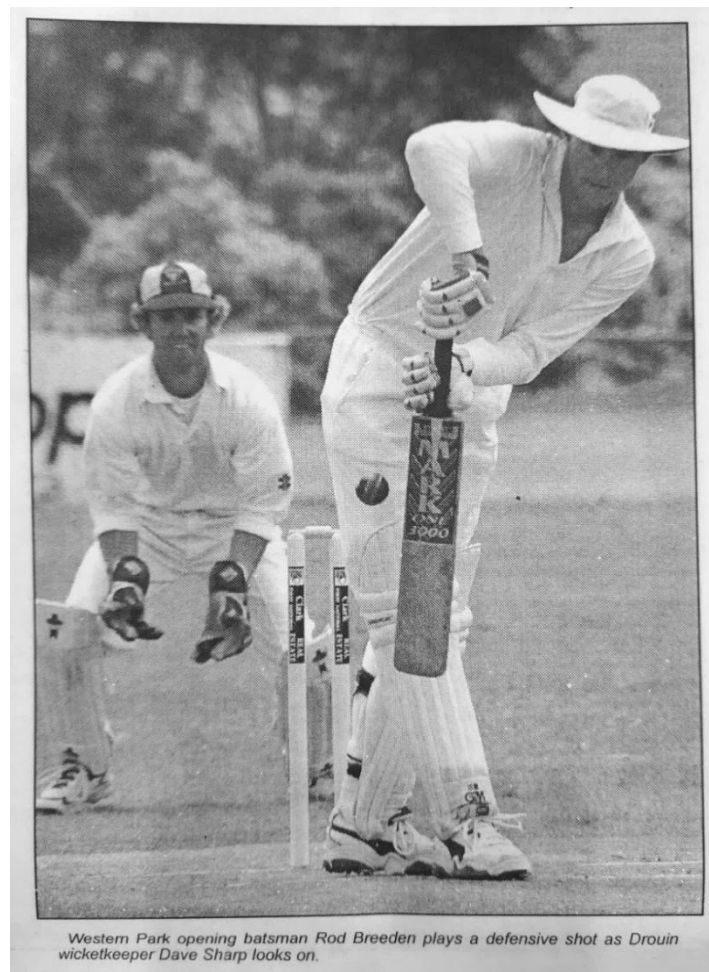

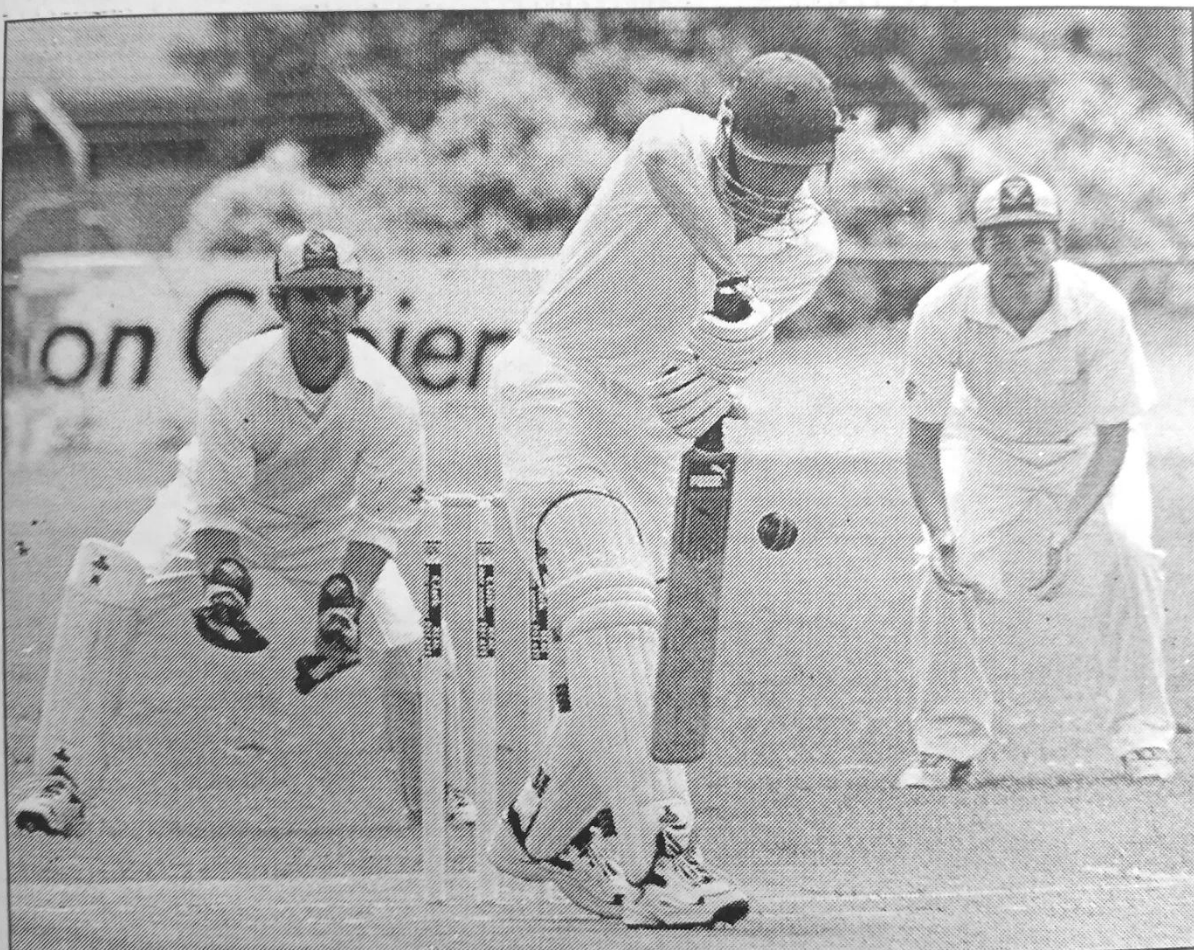

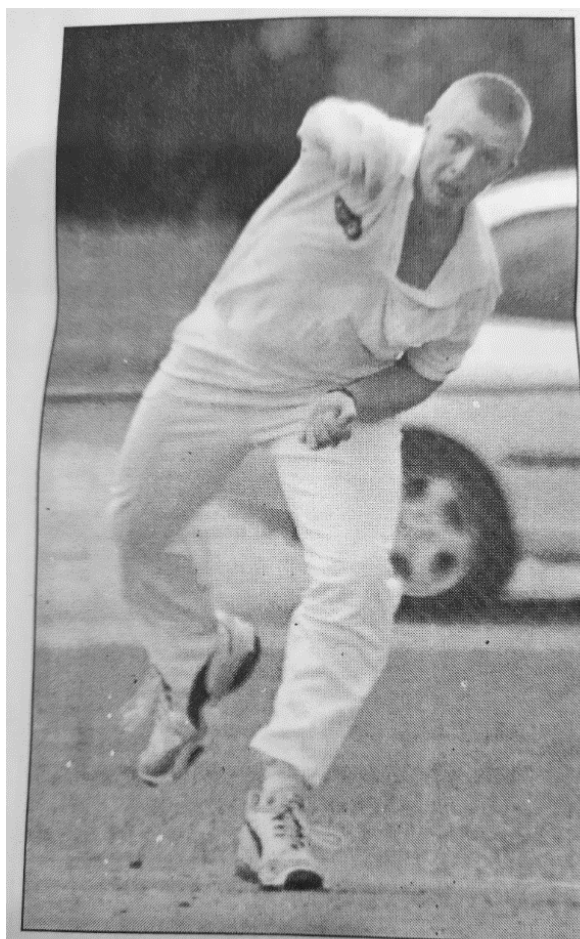

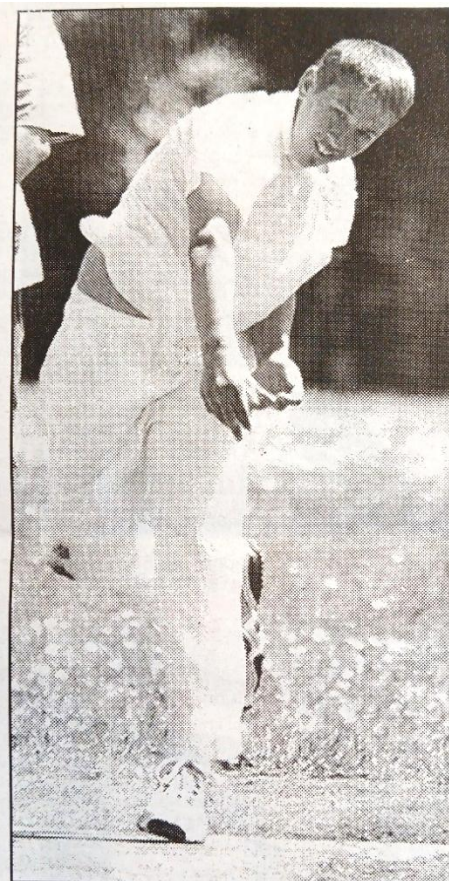

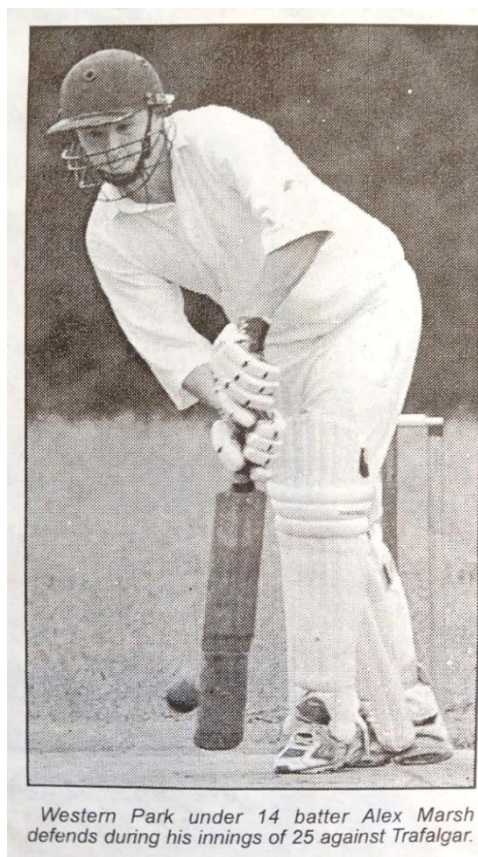
