Redevelopment needed for Western Park

The future of Western Park Recreation Reserve will be decided at a meeting tonight.

A management plan will be presented to Warragul Rural City Council's forward planning and policy committee when it is expected council and the reserve's committee of management will reach an agreement.

The plan includes a "wish-list" of capital items believed necessary to develop Western Park into a top level recreation area able to compete for major sporting events such as Latrobe Valley Football League finals, AFL practice matches and being a base for a future Gippsland VSFL team.

The plan said the oval is currently used 12 months of the year for more than 100 games of football, 60 games of cricket and numerous training sessions.

The ovals' deterioration and the lack of changerooms at Warragul Secondary College's oval prompted a call for the purchase of land in Tarwin St, adjacent to the reserve, for development of an additional oval.

The initial cost, identified in 1988/89, of such a project was estimated to be \$100,000, to be shared by council and the football clubs.

At a meeting last week council also considered a letter which said facilities at school ovals should be upgraded before council builds a second oval.

The letter from Warragul Industrials under 17s coach Steve Howe indicated his concern at proposals to build an alternative training venue for football teams currently based at the Western Park oval.

Mr Howe said the only reason the ground was in poor condition this year was its overuse.

He said last year the senior teams of both Warragul and Warragul Industrials used the ground one night each for training.

He said training schedules were revised this year resulting in training going from two nights a week to five.

"It was only a matter of time before bad weather and the training schedule made the situation untenable and so in the interests of ground preservation, Dusties permanently switched to the Warragul Regional College oval," he said.

He said the proposal to purchase adjacent land to build a second training venue would be costly.

He said council should first look at redeveloping the shower/toilet facilities at the Warragul Regional College oval.

Mr Howe said a local builder had indicated the cost of such a project would be less than \$40,000.

"I am sure the college would jump at the opportunity to be involved in such a redevelopment as it would be of great benefit to its students," he said.

Mr Howe said these were his personal views and did not necessarily reflect those of the club.

Sports Shorts with Peter Gallasch

The Warragul and District Cricket Association Executive met last week and regraded some teams to even up C and D grades.

A grade will consist of the 10 teams which nominated and B grade will consist of one team from each of the 14 clubs.

There will be eight teams in C grade and eight in D grade, some of which have been regraded.

C grade teams are Buln Buln, Bunyip, Darnum, Drouin, Longwarry, Neerim District, Nilma Dusties and Yarragon.

D grade teams are Buln Buln, Darnum, Ellinbank, Garfield, Hallora, Warragul, Western Park and Yarragon.

Some clubs will no doubt be disappointed at being regraded, but I believe that the Executive has looked at the "big picture" and has done an excellent job.

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There will also be changes to the one and two day format this season.

B, C and D grades will play six one day games and seven two day fixtures, while A grade will remain on two one day games and nine two day games.

One of the reasons to have 13 rounds is so that the B grade teams will play each other once.

One day games this season will be a maximum of 35 overs not 40 and bowlers will be restricted to ten overs each with no batting restrictions.

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Western Park Cricket Club will play its A grade home games at the Drouin Recreation Reserve this season.

This is to allow major work to be carried out at Western Park, and then time for regrowth and recovery.

The club is hopeful that it can play its last few rounds at "home" or at least be able to host some finals.

Western Park B and D grade will alternate their home games at St Pauls.

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Council supports Western Park management plan

The Western Park management plan has been supported by Warragul Rural City council.

Council's forward planning and policy committee last week decided to adopt the plan, which includes a wish list of future developments at the site the management committee believes are necessary for continued development.

However council also wants a meeting organised to form strategies to overcome some of the problems with the oval during its peak usage times.

At its recent estimates meeting, council allocated \$10,000 for oval works and \$12,000 for works at the Answerth Pavilion.

The management plan identifies a number of other developments aimed

at making Western Park a top level recreation centre able to compete for major sporting events or be a possible home base for a future Gippsland VSFL team.

Administrative officer Mark Glover said Warragul was an ideal venue for a VSFL team, having close proximity to both Melbourne and the Latrobe Valley.

However he said appropriate facilities such as improved carparking, toilet and changerooms and an electronic scoreboard were necessary.

Deputy town clerk David Young told council the additional facilities would still require funding allocations in council budgets, and were conditional on funding being available.

Cr Arthur Hewson said he was quite happy with

the management plan, which he described as a "step in the right direction".

However Cr Kevin Collis said if Western Park did not expand to a VSFL club, and continued to be used by local football clubs only, they should be the major contributor to the improvements.

Cr Ian Clark moved that council merely receive the management plan, not committing itself to funding the developments.

Cr Brian Davies and Cr Hewson moved an amendment to adopt the plan.

Cr Davies said there was a need for direction, and that with the council to be replaced with a commissioner under local government review, even more direction was needed.

Cr Daniels said that if there was no funding available at later dates for the various improvements there would have to be some other arguments put forward.

Cr John Daniels said Western Park needed to be changed.

He said facilities such as the pool, arts centre and indoor sports centre were put in the town to be used, and when the amount of people using Western Park the money councils spent there was balanced up, "Western Park misses out badly".

Cr Daniels said Western Park had been put in the wrong spot to start with, and that the land should

have been used for parkland.

"If it had been put on decent ground, we wouldn't have had the problems," he said.

He said there had been little consultation with relevant user groups in Western Park's developments.

"We need to change the philosophy of the way we look at it," he said.

Cr Daniels said Western Park could be a tourist attraction, an entertainment area and a fitness centre, and council should "make it into something" in the way it had developed the arts centre and other attractions.

Cr Clark said he had nothing against the philosophy of the document, but was still concerned how it was to be funded.

He said if council adopted the plan, it was agreeing in a de facto way to fund the developments.

"If we don't intend to fund these things, we shouldn't adopt them in principle," he said.

Cr Davies' amendment was carried, and becoming the motion, was also carried.

Council is expected to approve the committee's endorsement of the management plan at its meeting tonight.

Council also decided to arrange a meeting of various Western Park user groups to investigate any ways the park and other facilities can be better utilised.

Bryan McLean also bowled one over conceding five runs and whilst proceeding to set his field for the second over, ‘Captain Gavo’ and ‘Mr. Squiggle’ decided ‘Scruffy’s’ fitness was only capable of lasting one over and took him off. The only highlight for Hallora was Jim McMahon’s very good knock of 50. Neerim South's batting can only be described as undisciplined, with all batsmen throwing their wickets away. Apart from some keystone cops fielding, Western Park had Neerim South all out for 112 by tea. Best of the bowlers was 'Scruffy' with 4/41 off 16.

Chasing 112 for first innings points Western Park started well with Wayne Naylor making 42. At 1/60, things looked comfortable, at 6/96 things looked shaky but Peter Croft and the master blaster Mat Ridgway took the Park past Neerim's score comfortably. 'Mr Squiggle' made 45 and 'Ridgy' made 30 not out, 22 of which came off the last over. Week Two started with Mick Roberts completing an over. Neerim South made 160 with not a lot of resistance. Buln Buln CC wants penalties introduced for unfair conditions

The condition of cricket grounds, particularly the length of the grass on the first day compared to the second day, has often been a sore point among competing teams.

The length of the grass and hence the quickness of the ground has can have a marked effect on the outcome of the match.

Over the years a home team who was bowling on the second day has been criticised (usually behind their backs) if the ground was not as short as the week before when the home team batted.

The Buln Buln Cricket Club has written to the Warragul and District Cricket Association with some suggestions as to how this problem could possibly be overcome.

The letter was written following complaints from BBCC B grade captain Ron Sell about the condition of the Darnum Cricket Ground on November 26.

The letter suggests that

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the WDCA should establish from every club, who is responsible for cutting their grounds (Shire or club).

If the club is responsible, the WDCA to advise in writing that the grounds must be cut the same length on both days.

The letter suggests that a deputation be made to the Shires to get a commitment for grounds to be cut the same each week, and if that is not possible then a grant be made to the WDCA to engage a private contractor to cut all shire maintained grounds.

BBCC goes on to say that it realises that those issues will not be resolved overnight and suggests the following interim measures could be implemented immediately.

* The toss of the coin be

dispensed with and the visiting side can decide whether it wishes to bat or bowl first.

* The toss of the coin be retained, however, if the home side wins the toss and elects to bat and the same conditions are not provided when the visiting side bats, then 25% or 33% of runs scored by the home side be deducted from their score to compensate for the unfair conditions.

The WDCA would have to rate all grounds as to what percentage would apply.

These are very strong recommendations from the Buln Buln Cricket Club, but it is an issue that has caused much controversy in the past and must be addressed.

WDCA president Roger Barnes told me that the executive is looking at the situation and will give consideration to Buln Buln's suggestions.

He said the WDCA would like to hear from any other club that has any suggestions and added that the BBCC letter had been distributed to all clubs for comment.

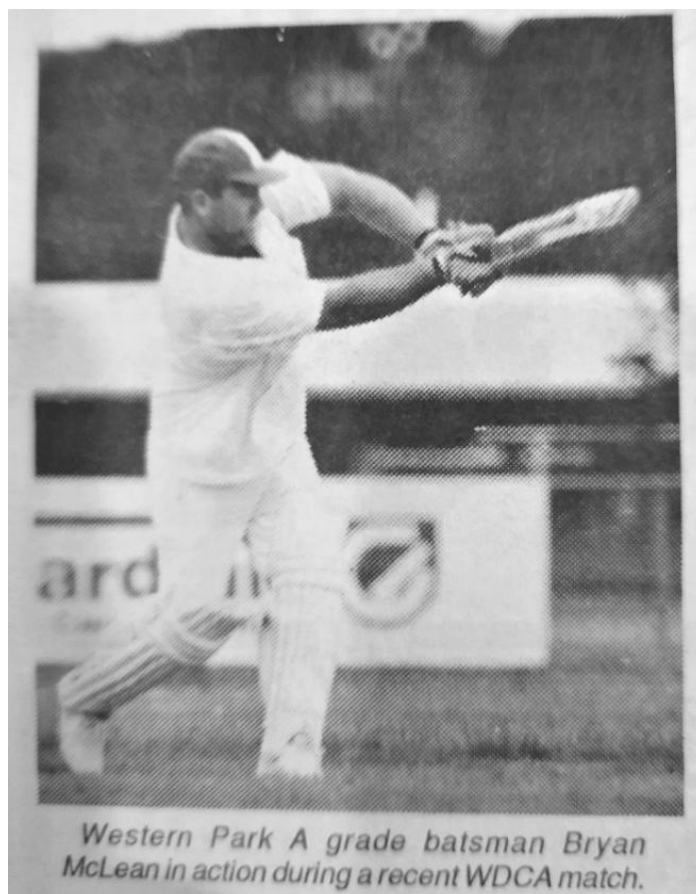

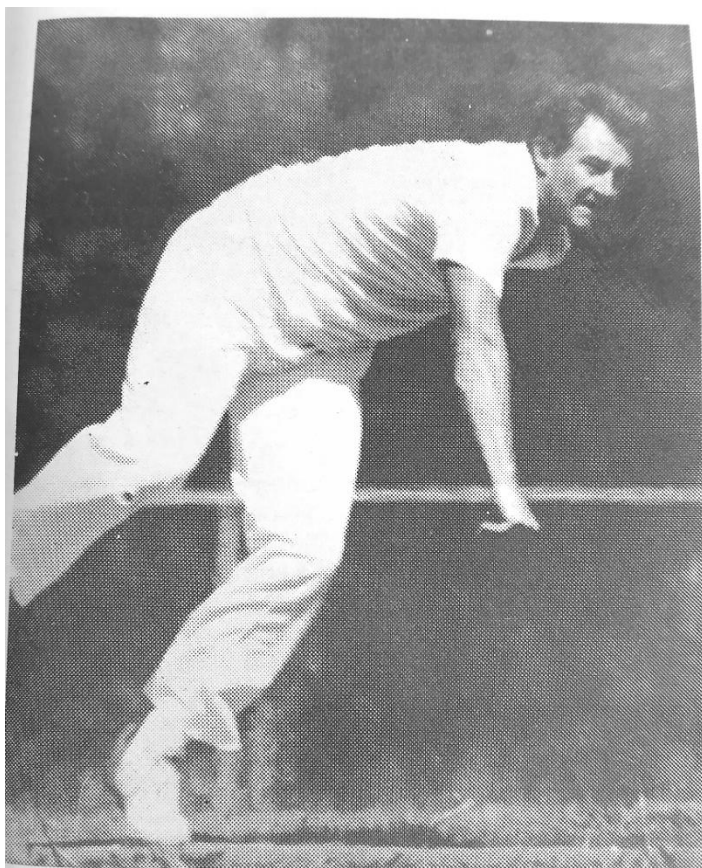

To Paul Jeffrey (B-Grade Captain) and Peter Gallasch (D-Grade Captain) who both did a great job in supporting Gavo and helped make our on-field performance a success this year. Well done! To Rod Breeden and Peter Gallasch, our Junior Coaches who did a great job with limited success. I know they would have liked a lot more help from all senior players, such as helping out at training or supporting them on a Saturday morning because the kids are the future of the club. To Peter Croft – who is the hardest worker at the club – did a great job as Treasurer and attended league meetings and was also great support to me. Thanks ‘Crofty’. To Jack Naylor who was a great President over the three previous years, thanks for your help and support. Jack and Rod did a great job going to Western Park Management Committee meetings and reporting back.

Rod is also the hard worker behind this publication. To all the other committee members in PJ, Mick Roberts, 'Rex', and 'Scruffy', who all worked well together, I appreciate your help and support. Thanks to everyone else who helped out over the year and remember, don't wait to be asked because as they say, many hands make light work. To all our sponsors, I would like to thank them for the support which was very much appreciated by the club and I hope their support will carry on for a long time to come. Get behind them and support our sponsors. To all other people who supported our functions, the 1-60 Draw, the \$50 Draw, or if you just came up for refreshments after the game, your company and support was appreciated by all. A-Grade Report (by Paul Gavin from the Western Park CC Annual Report)

"I believe A-Grade took a giant step towards a successful future this season and proved once again that we will not lay down no matter what obstacles are presented. The obstacles I talk of were the loss of three good players and not having the use of our home ground. We replaced the three players lost with a great competitor in Mat Ridgway (who won the bowling award), and a host of young players in Brad Crole, Mick McPhail, Matt Willis, and Fabian Peters. In overcoming these obstacles, we used 17 players, while winning 7 and losing 6 out of the 13 games to finish runners-up. The contributing factors to our success were a committed bowling attack that had no stars but worked hard as a team to remove opposing batsmen. Our batting provided a couple of shining lights in Brad Crole who opened the batting, learnt a lot, and showed glimpses of a bright future in this spot. Bryan McLean (who won the batting award and Club Champion) really took the bit between the teeth this season and realised his all-round worth to the team. The rest of us may have been a little below par but nevertheless worked hard and weren't as heavily relied upon this year.

But I have a feeling the greatest contributing factor by far was the injection of youth into the team, which gave us not only more options in our batting and bowling, but for the most part helped provide a sharper fielding combination. To continue to improve I think we need to encourage new players to join the club while continuing to develop the young players currently with us. I would like to see every player make a concerted effort to bring a new player to the club next season!"

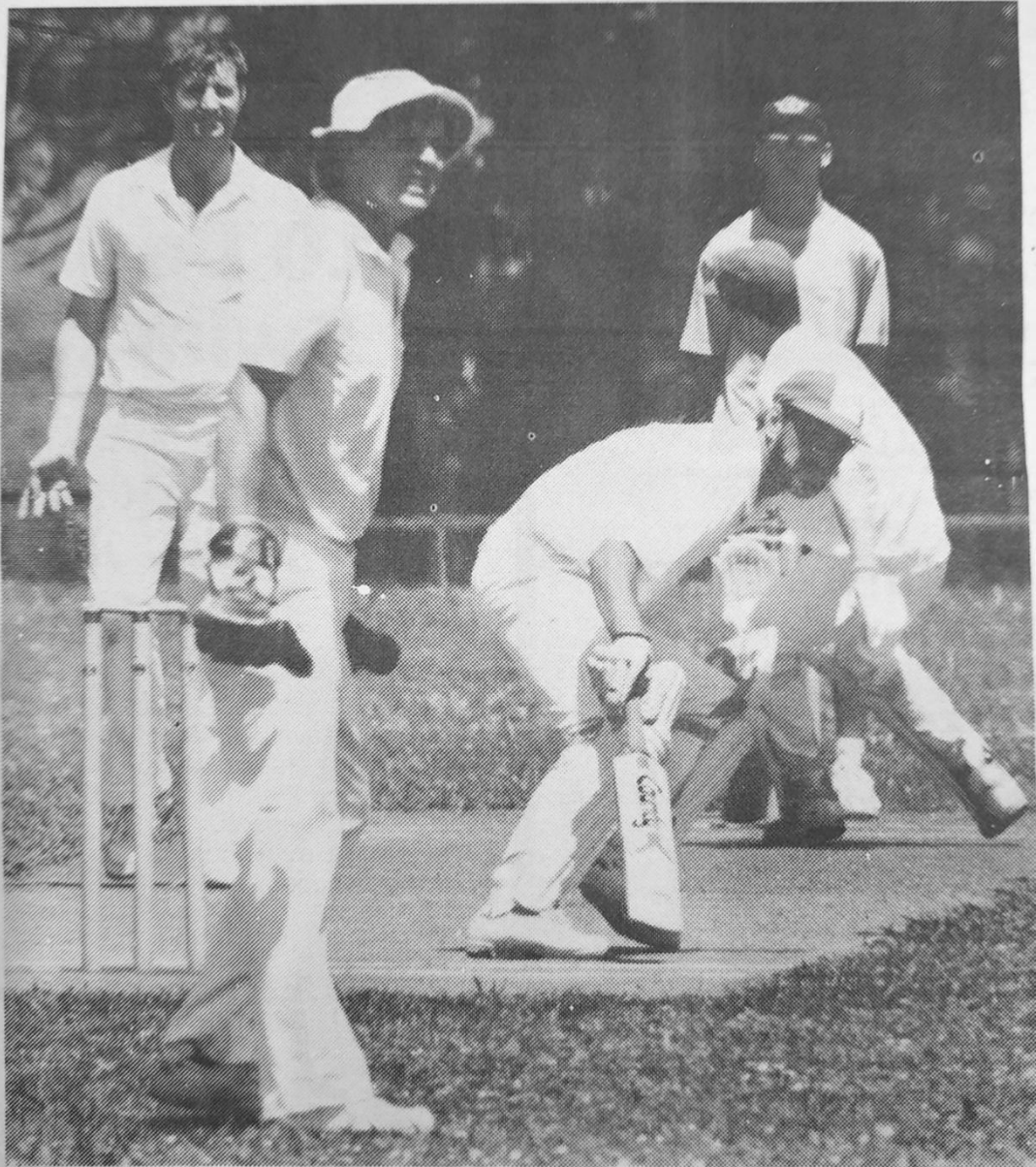

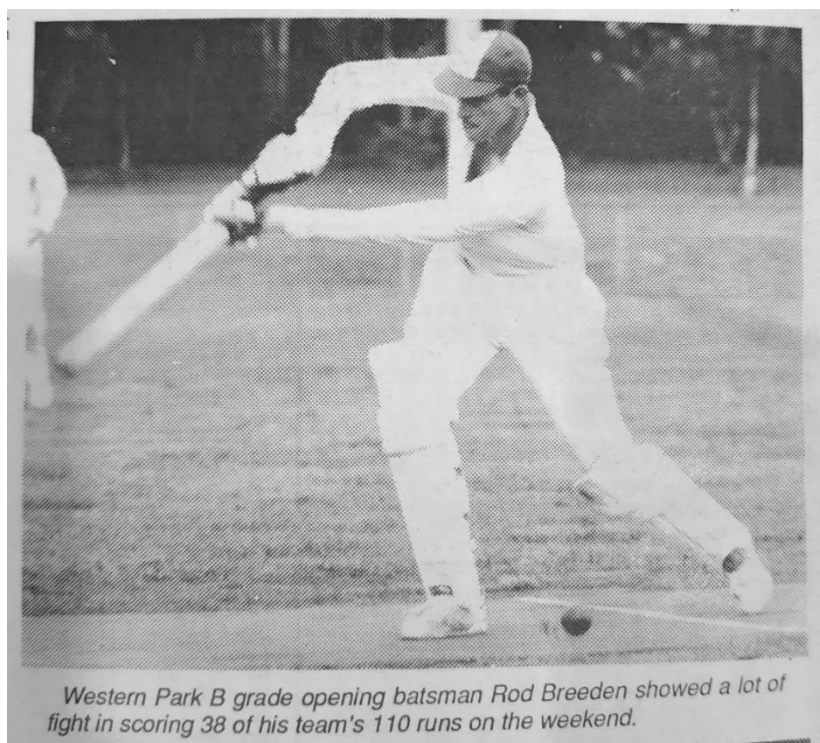

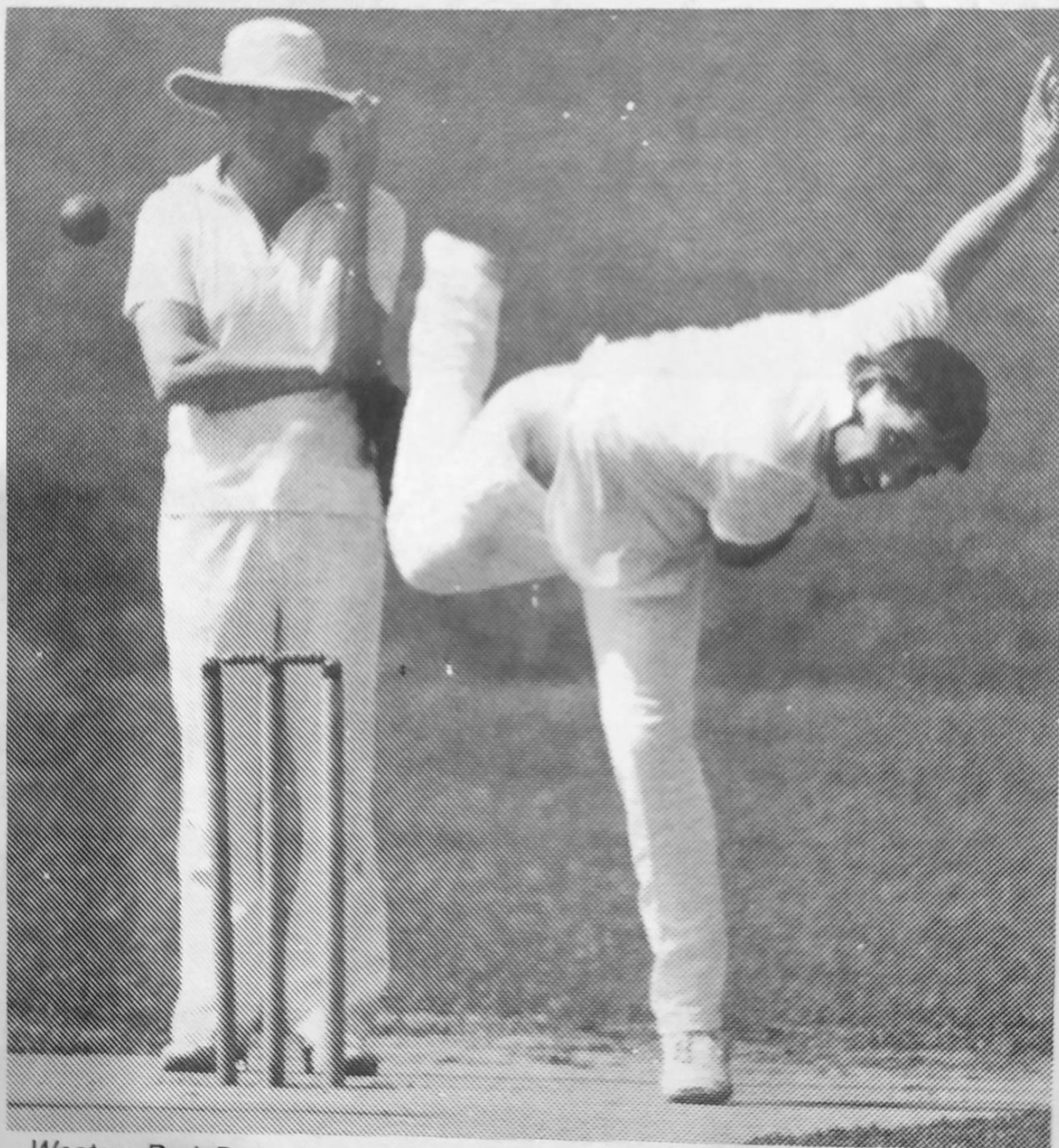

From the Gazette: “The D-Grade match was evenly poised at the resumption of play with the Park on 5/138 chasing 205. Nilma Dusties had the chance to swing it their way on the second ball of the day when Mick Hughes got a top edge to a Dave Sowerby bouncer. It flew gently...and was headed for the normally safe hands of captain Tim Gargan...but alas the catch was put down. Mick was dropped again before going on to make a fantastic 53 not out. His partner at the start of the day, Tony Straatman, resumed on 37 and was also dropped three times before being out for a very patient 50. Mark Freeman made nine (dropped second ball he faced) and Barry Donnellon not out to see the Park to 7/207 and victory. It was Barry’s first premiership in about forty years of senior cricket.”

D-Grade Report (by Peter Gallasch, from Western Park CC Annual Report)

“After a disappointing 1993-94 season, the 1994-95 season didn’t look to be promising for the club’s lowest senior grade. But after some pre-season conversations it became apparent that we were going to have the services of a couple of handy new recruits to top up the nucleus of the previous year’s team. Before the season started our C-Grade team was regraded to D-Grade by the WDCA Executive – fair enough given our finishing position the year before. Our season began with a forfeit, an outright win (using only four batsmen) and a bye, so unfortunately many of our players hardly got a hit before Christmas. This was occurring because we were bowling teams out cheaply and then not losing too many wickets in the run chase. Clearly the regrading had backfired somewhat because we were totally out-classing most of our opponents. After going through the home-and-away season undefeated we had a real scare in the Semi-Final when it appeared we had lost by one run. But inspection of the books and a WDCA Executive meeting ruled the game was a tie, so naturally we went into the Grand Final. [That] was also a tough match – with six catches dropped our worst fielding exhibition of the year – but we were able to make the required 205 runs needed for victory.

It was the first senior flag the club had won for over ten years and also the first premiership most of us had played in, including veteran Parker Barry Donnellon. It was a fitting result as we were the best team in D-Grade, with players like Mark Freeman, Mick Hughes, James Barry, and Adam Steenholdt unable to break into the B-Grade side because our depth was so great. Tony Straatman wasn’t exactly a dedicated clubman, but his natural ability saw him win our batting and bowling averages – as well as the WDCA bowling average and D-Grade Cricketer of the Year. In his first year of cricket, Mick Hughes deserves a mention for his endeavour, performance and commitment which led to him receiving my Captain’s Award. Mark Freeman also had an outstanding season and was the key player in the final’s series taking five wickets in the semi-final and six in the Grand Final.”

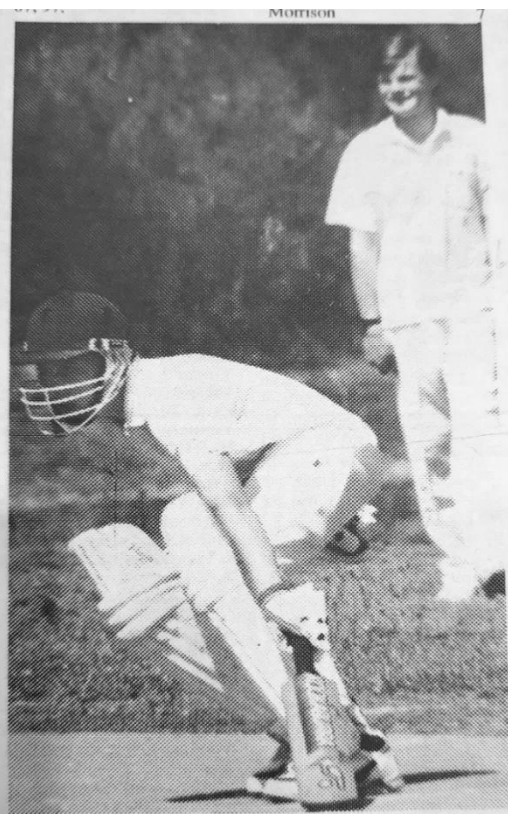

U-16 Report (by Rod Breeden, from Western Park CC Annual Report)

“Season 1994/95 saw the majority of our U-16 players come from last year’s U-14 runners-up side and with that in mind the season was always going to be a learning year for the boys. Our batting was led by ‘Mr. Bean’ Heath Tutton with 191 runs at 31.80 and scoring our only half-century for the year. He formed a very solid opening partnership with Aaron Doyle – 140 runs at 23.30 – but unfortunately our batting fell away after these two batsmen.
