Western Park board upgrade

The Western Park scoreboard is to be repaired and upgraded following a decision made at last week's Warragul Rural City Council meeting.

Council voted to provide a grant of up to \$2500 to the Western Park committee of management on a dollar for dollar basis for the supply of materials to upgrade the scoreboard.

Council's contribution will be funded from the recreation development fund.

This motion was first passed at council's forward planning and policy committee meeting a week earlier, following extensive debate.

It was an amendment to a motion which originally called for the money to be provided as a loan to tenants the Warragul Football Club and the Warragul Industrials Football Club.

It needed to be ratified at last week's council meeting.

Cr Hedy Kirkbride requested that it be dealt with separately to the rest of the committee minutes.

Committee chairman Cr Kevin Collis moved that the grant be provided, stating that council was a part-owner of Western Park.

He said the scoreboard was in a disgusting state, having been vandalised over summer.

Cr Kirkbride attempted to move an amendment that the request be suspended until after April

30 when other sporting and community groups had a chance to make submissions for grants.

In answer to a question from Cr Brian Davies, it was stated this meant no money would be available for the scoreboard until after estimates in September, at the end of the football season.

Seconding Cr Kirkbride's motion, Cr Ian Clark said Western Park should not be allowed to jump the queue.

Cr Arthur Hewson said the scoreboard would be seen by visitors to War-

ragul and it should be a matter of community pride that it would be kept in good repair.

Cr Kirkbride's amendment lost while Cr Collis' motion succeeded.

A successful motion from the forward planning and policy committee that the Warragul Football Club and the Warragul Industrials Football Club be granted permission to apply for a planning permit to instal two lighting towers at the Western Park oval automatically passed without debate.

From the Gazette: "Yarragon and Western Park played a one-day game and in a close finish the reigning A-Grade premiers won by seven runs. Yarragon batted first, and a good opening partnership of 41 between Peter Mazza (23) and Shaun Litaize (21) set them up. The ground was very slow, with shots that would normally go for four only being rewarded with two or sometimes three runs. Peter Kilday (24 n.o.) and Tony Kleeven (23 n.o.) were the other Yarragon batsmen to get going, and Western Park's best bowler was normal wicket-keeper Paul Gavin with 2/31 off nine overs.

Western Park lost four early wickets but then a solid partnership of 65 between Paul Gavin (30) and Peter Croft (44) put them in a winning position. Three middle-order 'ducks' put an end to that however and the Parkers were all out for 130. Rick Minichiello bowled very well for Yarragon taking 3/22 off his 10 overs and Mick O'Toole cleaned up the innings taking 3/19 off 5.1 at the end."

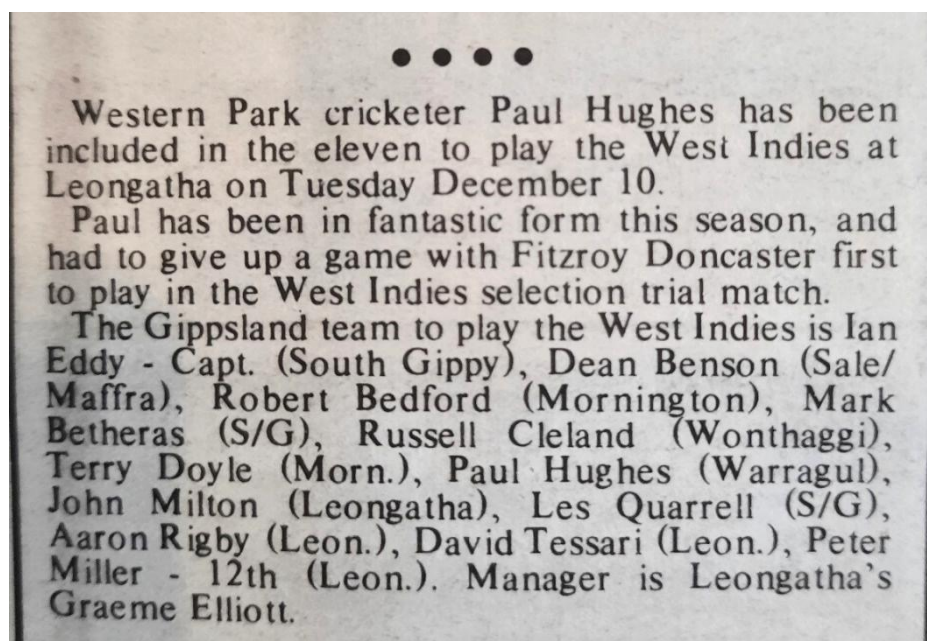

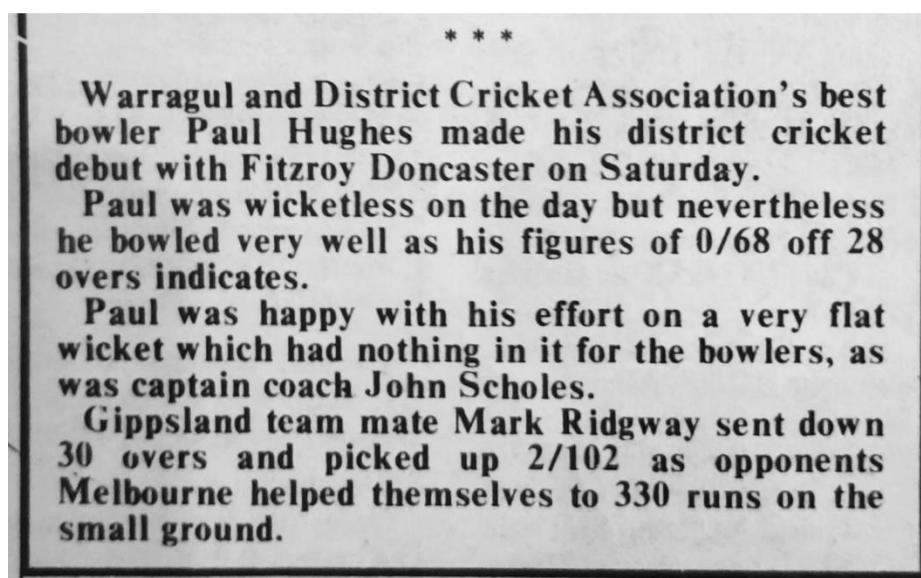

Victorian Country XI vs. West Indies

The Leongatha Recreation Reserve was a scene of color and anticipation for the Victorian Country eleven versus West Indies cricket match last Tuesday, which was witnessed by about 6000 people.

The organising committee had done a power of work to get the ground in magnificent condition, and had also constructed a special scoreboard and sight screens to be used during the match.

The only thing they had no control over was the weather, and you wouldn't want to know it, but after a week or so of magnificent weather it decided to rain on the morning of the big match.

The scheduled start of play was 10.30 am, but the drizzle started about 9.30 and by 10.30 was very steady.

There didn't look to be any break in the weather until about 11.30 when a bit of a breeze sprang up and started to blow the clouds away.

The announcement that everyone was waiting for echoed over the PA system about 11.45. "The match has been shortened to 35 overs and play will commence at 12.30."

As it turned out play didn't start until 12.50 and the match was further reduced to 30 overs each.

The Windies batted first and openers Carlisle Best and Philo Wallace looked a little uncomfortable against the pace of Mornington Peninsula's Terry

Doyle and Sale Maffra's Dean Benson.

They eventually broke the shackles and put on a 60 run partnership before Best was caught by keeper David Tessari off the bowling of Mark Betheras.

Shortly afterwards Wallace tried to hook a short ball from vice captain Benson only to get a top edge which flew into the grill of his helmet, bending the metal and necessitating some dental work.

Wallace retired hurt to have his injury treated.

Meanwhile Warragul's Paul Hughes was bowling from the other end and after bowling a wide for his first delivery he settled down well.

Paul strayed onto the pads a bit too often and was hit for four on two occasions, but the West Indian batsmen had a lot of respect for his bowling when he pitched the ball up outside off stump.

Paul finished with 0/26 off his allotted six overs which was a good effort.

The West Indies went on to make 4/143 off 30 overs, and some big hitting late in the innings from Carl Hooper (including three big sixes) had the crowd roaring with approval.

The country lads did a fairly good job, without ever threatening, and finished with 5/98 off the 30 overs.

Big West Indian Curtley Ambrose opened the bowling, and was only loping in off a shortened run up, but was still generating good pace.

Anderson Cummins from the other end wasn't

holding back however and he bowled very quickly.

Foster's Mark Betheras top scored with 26 and Les Quarrell (Toora) made 21 not out.

The crowd became more vocal as the game went on and the weather fined up, and by the end of the day there was a real carnival atmosphere around the ground.

A number of the West Indian players including champion opening batsman Desmond Haynes and captain Richie Richardson signed autographs for excited fans throughout the day and they mixed freely with spectators after the game.

Despite the dismal start to the day, the whole venture turned out to be a great success, and zone 11 of the VCCL is to be congratulated on the professional way it conducted the whole exercise.

Peter Kilday also made a good half century before being bowled around his legs by Rudi DeVent for 52.

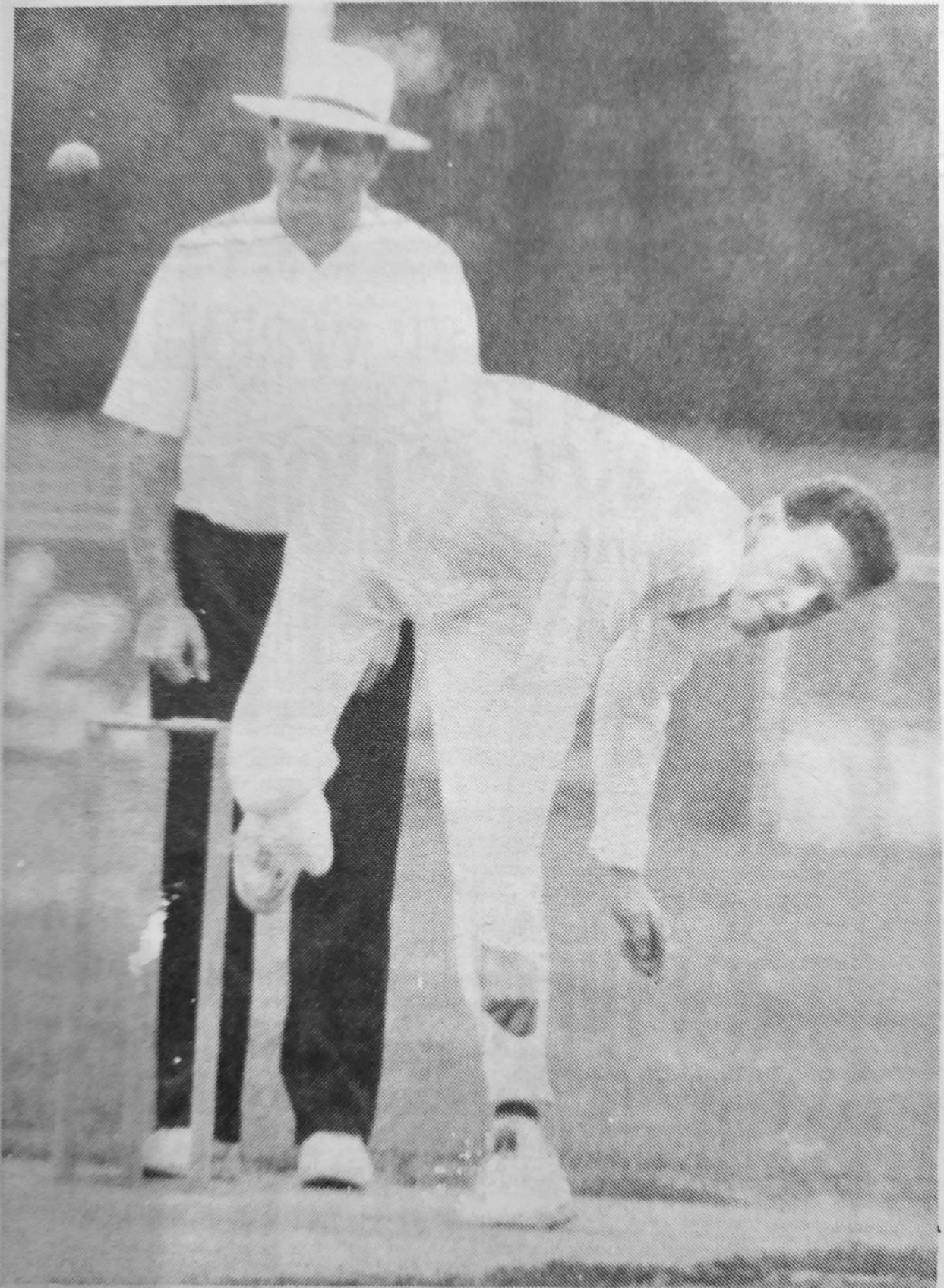
He and Nick put on a solid 76 run partnership.

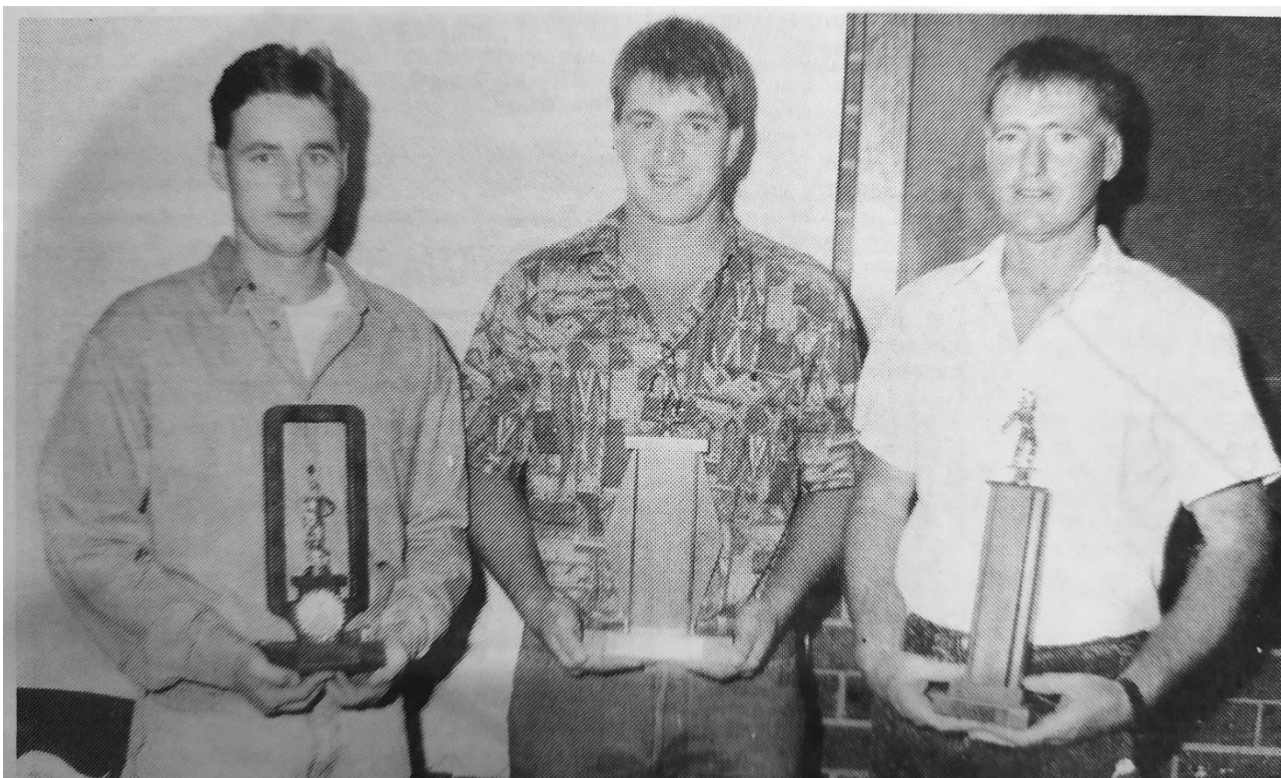
Tony Kleeven also bowled well to take 3/40 off 22 overs and Rick Minichiello bowled fast and finished with 2/44 off 15.5

Once again, this year, our Juniors were under the astute leadership of George Purton, who lead them into the finals. Unfortunately, they were beaten in the Semi-Final but overall had a very good year. Well done boys! Finally, I must congratulate Peter Croft on being awarded Life Membership of the Club. Everyone would agree a more deserving person would be hard to find. A few more people with Peter's keenness and attitude around the club and we could see all of our teams into the finals as Yarragon did this year. Western Park has worked itself into a good position both on and off the field but remember it doesn't just happen. It required an effort from everyone. Make sure you put in the effort."

A-Grade Captain's Report (by Paul Gavin – from Western Park CC Annual Report)

"I would like to start by thanking WPCC for not only presenting me with a great challenge, but for the support I received throughout. Most of the 21 players who played A-Grade throughout Season 91/92 can be reasonably pleased with their efforts, some more than others. We played 13 matches in all, winning eight, losing four, and one was drawn – finishing Runners-Up, but nonetheless a season to be highlighted.

Well done to Peter Croft on his Life Membership and winning the Association's Batting Average. Also, Wayne and Chris on Country Week Selection. Special thanks to Chris Ayres (Vice-Captain). His input on and off the field has been a great asset not only to me, but also the club.

Although we walked away empty-handed again this year, I sense the feeling around the club is not one of total devastation but one of determination. We are heading in the right direction, and have some finals wins under our belt now...I feel through persistence we'll keep improving and the Pennant will be won, and richly deserved by everyone associated with the Park."

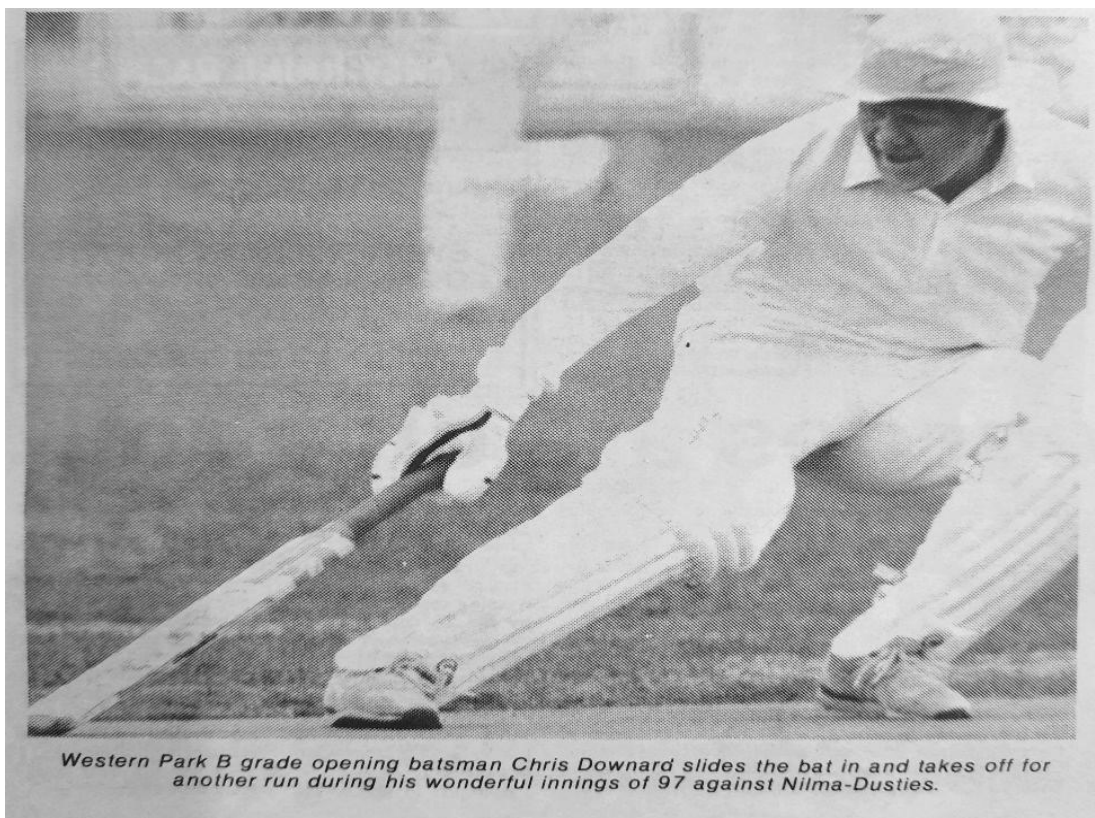

B-Grade Captain's Report (by John Donnellon – from Western Park CC Annual Report)

“Season 1991/92 saw a marked improvement in the performance of Western Park B-Grade. After finishing at the bottom of the ladder last season, we were in the finals race right up until the last game. We won 5 out of 11 games which was a good effort as in most games we had a very young side which lacked a lot of senior cricket experience. The season got off to a great start with an outright victory over the lowly Jindivick. Apart from this game the other highlight was the mammoth 214-run victory over Nilma Dusties. Opening batsman Chris Downward deserves a special mention for his great innings of 97 in this game. He was a bit unlucky being given out LBW just three runs short of a century.

With more cricket experience and natural improvement Mick should develop into a very good senior cricketer for the club. Shane made 296 runs at an average of 29.6, took eight wickets, and was easily one of our best fieldsmen each week. He took up the hard task of batting at number three with great responsibility and played many good team innings.

Next season B-Grade must aim for further improvement and to play in the finals. To do this all players must be committed to playing and training at the start of the season. If this is done, we should be able to have a more consistent season and hopefully be there with the best sides at the business end of the season.”

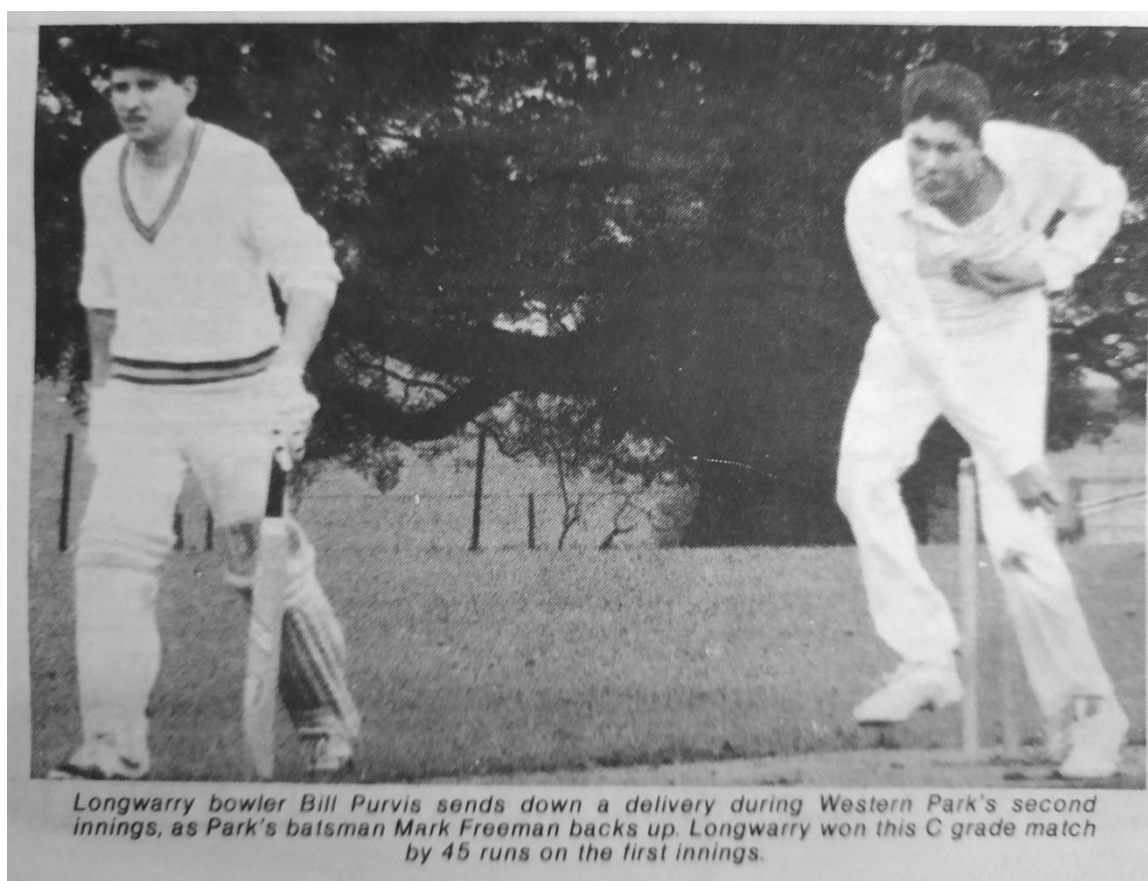

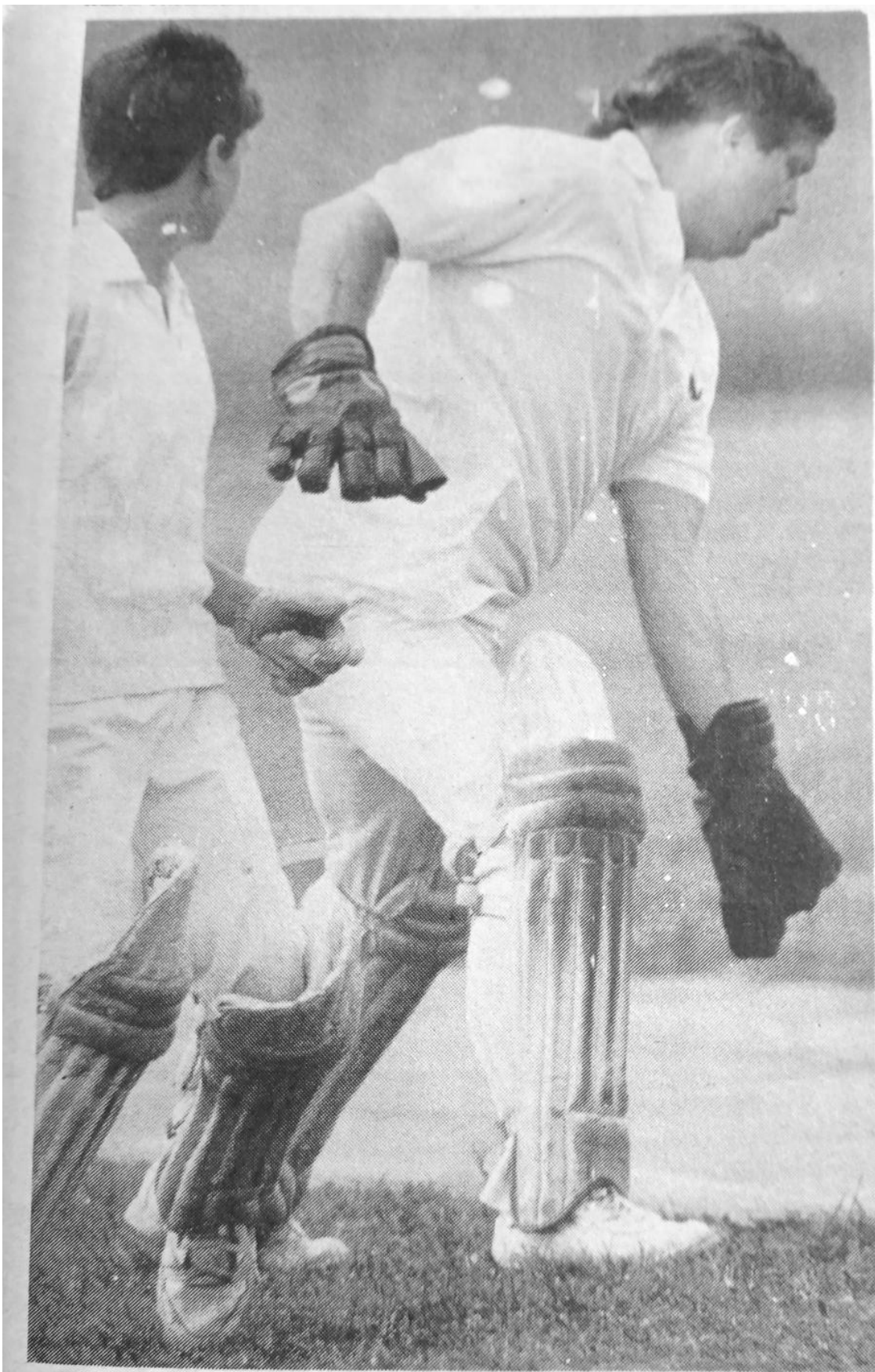

C-Grade Captain's Report (by Brian Lemon – from Western Park CC Annual Report)

"It's going to be a long hot summer!" Was the remark made to me by a senior member of the side as we walked off the ground on the last day of the second match. Those words accurately summed up the situation facing C-Grade for the rest of the season. For it was very clear early in the season that C-Grade was again to be the victim of part-time A and B-Grade players, this was further compounded by the fact that not only had the side lost both opening bowlers and one opening batsmen from the previous season, these players included batting and bowling trophy winners. The net replacement was one player – who was of genuine C-Grade standard – and he was unable to play the full season due to personal commitments. At least he made that clear before the start of the season.

One could not say that the season was satisfying from a cricketing viewpoint, with only one win, and the rest of the points coming from two byes and forfeit of points by Drouin for playing unregistered players. From a captain's point of view the only positive aspect of the season was the great spirit and support displayed by all members of the side, in spite of losing game after game. I thank them for that. When a lack of players finally forced my fellow selectors into playing those juniors who were keen to play C-Grade, I derived some satisfaction from the way Brad Crole applied himself to senior cricket, his attitude and application to his game is far and away in advance of his youthful age. Together with Chris Hinsley, Brad from a very capable opening bowling attack, an attack we should have had from the start of the season. Brad also proved to be a very sound opening batsman. He will be an outstanding all-rounder.

I have been associated with the club since the early seventies and can only remember one other season when promising juniors regularly played lower-grade cricket, one of those players is our current club coach. One can only assumed the experience did him no harm perhaps it is time to rethink the current philosophy of playing junior members at the senior level. In other words, which team should they be playing in at the start of their senior experience. This must be considered for the overall long-term benefits of Western Park Cricket Club as a force in the WDCA in the future.”
